SYNOPSIS OF EVENTS:

On February 17, 2007 at approximately 0010 hours at 423 Cleveland Street #4, Kyle T. Brennan was pronounced dead by Clearwater Fire Paramedics after shooting himself in the head with a .357 Revolver.

SOURCE OF ACTIVITY:

Dispatched.

INVESTIGATIVE ACTION TAKEN:

I was dispatched to a suicide at 423 Cleveland Street. The call screen notes advised that a white male had shot himself in the head and was not responsive. I arrived on scene and met with Clearwater Fire Paramedics, Jerome Mourelayos and Shawn Becker. Paramedics advised that the white male, identified as Kyle T. Brennan, was pronounced dead at approximately 0010 hours.

I spoke with Kyle's father, Thomas M. Brennan. Thomas advised that he was at the apartment earlier that evening with Kyle. Thomas and Kyle had watched a movie and Thomas left the residence at approximately 1700 hours to go to work. Thomas went over to the Fairgrounds in Tampa to sell some reading literature. Thomas returned home later that evening and attempted to open the front door. However, there were three Crystal Spring, 5 gallon water jugs with a light green cap, blocking the front doorway. Thomas pushed open the door and called out for his son, Kyle. Thomas advised there was no answer and he could smell a faint odor of gunpowder. Thomas then went into his bedroom and discovered Kyle lying on the ground. Thomas went over to Kyle and noticed the gunshot wound to his head. Thomas checked his arm and realized he was unresponsive. Thomas immediately called his chaplain, Denise. After notifying Denise about the situation, Thomas called the police.

Thomas advised that Kyle has been suffering from Depression for the last 6-7 months. Kyle was living in Virginia with his mother until he ran away from home approximately 2 months ago. Kyle had traveled to various states and eventually ended up in Clearwater. Kyle contacted Thomas and decided to stay at the residence. Kyle was only living at the residence for one week. Kyle was subscribed a prescription of Lexapro 10 mg. for his depression. However, Thomas advised that Kyle was not taking his medication. Thomas stated that he did not believe in psychiatric medications because of his religious beliefs. Thomas encouraged Kyle to stop taking the medications and took the prescription bottle from him approximately 3 days ago. Kyle was scheduled to return to Virginia on Monday to move back with his mother. Thomas advised that he was working full time and did not feel that it was beneficial to leave Kyle alone at the

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residence.

Thomas advised that the .357 Revolver was stored in the night stand by his bed. However, Thomas never told Kyle there was a firearm inside the residence. The Revolver was stored in a green army bag. The firearm was unloaded and the rounds were kept in a separate location. Thomas could not remember exactly where he stored the ammunition.

The apartment has two main bedrooms and a common dining area. Thomas' bedroom is located on the southeast corner of the residence. Kyle's body was found in Thomas' bedroom. I then went into the bedroom and observed Kyle lying on the ground near the foot of the bed. Kyle was slumped over onto his left side. His head and left arm were resting inside a plastic laundry basket. Kyle's left arm was positioned up near his forehead. Kyle's right arm was positioned near his chest. I noticed the revolver was near his right hand. The entry wound appeared to be in Kyle's right temple and there was significant brain matter scattered on the ground and against some boxes near the east side of the bedroom. Paramedics had cut the back of Kyle's shirt and used that area to conduct their assessment. Kyle also had a small hunting knife, which was enclosed in a leather case on his belt.

I went into Kyle's bedroom, which is located on the northwest corner of the residence. I noticed that Kyle's bags were all packed up and placed on his bed. His bed did not have any covers or blankets on it and there were two pillows on top of the mattress. There was a small file folder on Kyle's bed. Sgt. McAuley took a look inside the file folder and advised that Kyle had written a letter to the FBI in reference to some sort of police corruption. There was also a small black plastic bag and some white rope placed on the floor by the bed.

I went back out and retrieved Kyle's prescription medication from Thomas' vehicle. The Lexapro 10 mg. was issued out on 11/24/2006. The prescription was issued by Doctor Stephen McNamara for a quantity of 30 pills, reference Rx 7019079. There were approximately 16 pills inside the bottle. Thomas advised that Kyle would only take the medication sporadically or when he felt like he needed it.

I conducted a canvass of the top floor and attempted to contact the neighbors. I knocked on apartment #5, which is located directly east of Thomas' apartment. There was no answer at the door. I then went over to apartment #6, which is directly south of Thomas' apartment and located next to the stairwell. A white male, identified as Ian W. Shilliganson, answered the door. Shilliganson advised that he went to sleep at approximately 2200 hours and did not hear any noises until I knocked on the front door.

Corporal Faulk requested a PCSO Forensic Technician to respond out to the scene. Corporal Faulk also notified the medical examiners office at approximately 0044 hours.

PCSO Technician J. McCabe arrived on scene and processed the area; please see McCabe's supplemental report for further information. The medical examiner, Marty Scholl, arrived on scene shortly after and conducted her investigation. I retrieved the firearm and noticed it was a Taurus .357 Revolver with a 5 round chamber. There was one spent casing and 4 live rounds inside the chamber. The serial number for the Taurus was #OC44668.

Scholl then rolled Kyle onto his back and lifted up his shirt. I noticed there was some writing on his stomach which stated, "Look inside." There were two rounds in Kyle's left pocket and a folded up piece

of paper with "11:00" written on it. There was also a folded note in Kyle's right pocket. PCSO Technician McCabe recovered the firearm, ammunition, hunting knife and notes as evidence.

Greg Daerr, from the medical examiners office, removed the body from the residence. Thomas had already left the scene and I secured the residence. I later placed the Lexapro into property as evidence.

PREVIOUS CASE STATUS:

Active/Remains Active with submission of this supplement report.

INVESTIGATION:

On 02-17-2007 at approximately 1500 hours, I was contacted by the Clearwater Police Department Communications Center and advised that the deceased father, Thomas Brennan, had contacted the police department. At this time, Mr. Brennan had additional questions as to whether he was able to move to another residence. Mr. Brennan wanted to be sure that he spoke with an Officer prior to leaving the residence. I advised the Communications Center that I would be coming on-duty on this date at 1600 hours and that I would review the investigation and contact Mr. Brennan.

On 02-17-2007 at approximately 1610 hours, I reviewed the initial investigation that was completed by District II Officer Jonathan Yuen. I noted that there were no signs of foul play observed within the residence and that the Medical Examiner's Office was contacted and responded to the scene. District Six Medical Examiner's Office Investigator Marti Scholl responded and conducted her investigation at the scene. As a result of this, I contacted the District Six Medical Examiner's Office on this date at approximately 1620 hours and requested that Investigator Scholl contact me regarding this incident

On 02-17-2007 at approximately 1640 hours, Investigator Scholl contacted me back and confirmed that there were no signs of foul play noted and that the evidence at the scene suggested that Kyle Brennan committed suicide with a firearm. At this time, the autopsy has been completed and no signs of foul play were noted during the procedure. Investigator Scholl requested that Next-of-Kin contact the District Six Medical Examiner's Office on 02-18-2007 after 0800 hours so that funeral home procedures could be discussed.

On 02-17-2007 at approximately 1645 hours, I made telephone contact with Kyle Brennan's father, Thomas Brennan at [727] 482-1817. At this time, Mr. Brennan advised that he was making arrangements to move to another residence on Pennsylvania Avenue in Clearwater. Mr. Brennan advised that due to the incident that had occurred, he was not able to remain at his current apartment. Mr. Brennan advised that he did not want to move out of the apartment until he contacted the Police Department. I advised Mr. Brennan that he was free to move from the apartment and that we did not have any reason to maintain

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control of the apartment. Mr. Brennan advised that he was not sure of the numerical address of the apartment he would be moving to however; he knew that it was located on Pennsylvania Avenue across from the park. Mr. Brennan advised that he would be maintaining his current cell phone number and that he could be contacted at that number if any additional questions were required.

I advised Mr. Brennan that he would need to contact the District Six Medical Examiner's Office on 02-18-2007 after 0800 hours so that the appropriate funeral home arrangements could be discussed. I provided the main District Six Medical Examiner's Office telephone number to Mr. Brennan.

On 02-23-2007 at approximately 1600 hours, I attempted to make telephone contact with District Six Medical Examiner's Office Forensic Investigator Marti Scholl. At this time, I wanted to inquire about any contact that would be made with Kyle Brennan's Doctor who had prescribed the Lexipro medication to him. At this time, I was advised that Investigator Scholl would not be back in the office until 02-26-2007. I requested that Investigator Scholl contact me on Monday 02-26-2007 via my department cell phone number.

On 02-26-2007 at approximately 0930 hours, Investigator Marti Scholl contacted me. At this time, Investigator Scholl confirmed that she would be contacting Kyle Brennan's doctor so to discuss his diagnoses and medication prescribed. Investigator Scholl advised that she would contact me once this information was obtained.

On 03-05-2007 at approximately 1400 hours, I received a voice-mail message from Detective Carl Brown with the Albemarle County Police Department in Charlottesville, Virginia. Detective Brown requested that I contact him at [434] 972-4038 regarding this investigation.

On 03-05-2007 at approximately 1510 hours, I attempted to make telephone contact with Detective Brown at which time I received his voice-mail system. I left a message requesting that Detective Brown contact me via my department cell phone.

On 03-05-2007 at approximately 1550 hours, I made telephone contact with Investigator Scholl who confirmed that she had spoke with Kyle Brennan's Doctor/Psychiatrist. The Doctor was identified as Dr. McNamera who is based out of Charlottesville, Virginia. The Doctor confirmed that Kyle Brennan had been exhibiting early signs of Schizophrenia to include paranoia and delusions and that he did prescribe Lexipro to Brennan. Dr. McNamera advised that Lexipro should be administered on a long term and regular basis for the proper results to be attained. Dr. McNamera advised that he was not aware of any major side effects if one was to suddenly stop taking Lexipro.

On 03-05-2007 at approximately 1635 hours, I made telephone contact with Thomas Brennan. At this time, I advised Brennan that I wanted to meet with him in an effort to learn additional history information about Kyle Brennan. Thomas Brennan agreed to meet with me at his new residence on 03-07-2007 at 1100 hours. The new residence address has been confirmed as 403 Pennsylvania Avenue in Clearwater.

While on the telephone with Thomas Brennan, I received a return call from Detective Brown with the Albemarle County Police Department. Detective Brown left a voice-message requesting that I contact his department cell phone number of [434] 531-5463.

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On 03-05-2007 at approximately 1640 hours, I returned the telephone call to Detective Brown at which time he advised me of the following information;

- That he took a Missing Person Report on 01-23-2007 whereby Kyle Brennan was reported missing by his mother, Victoria Britton [Albemarle County Virginia Police Department report #2007-00765]
- That Kyle Brennan left his residence on 11-27-2006 and removed approximately \$8000.00 from his own bank account.
- That Britton received a telephone call from an FBI Agent in Des Moines, Iowa.
- That Britton was advised that her son had been at the FBI office and had advised that he was being followed by persons who were after him.
- That the FBI Agent was identified as Special Agent Jeff Atwood.
- That Brennan appeared as if he had not been eating, was emaciated and appeared to be having delusions.
- That Brennan, at the time of his encounter with the FBI, had approximately \$5000.00 on his person.
- That Brennan did provide his home telephone number to the FBI and then left the office.
- That the FBI contacted Brennan's mother in Virginia and advised of Kyle Brennan's arrival at their office.
- That Brennan then traveled to San Diego, California and stayed with his Aunt from 01-08-2007 until 01-15-2007.
- That Brennan then traveled to Maui, Hawaii whereby he contacted the police after an altercation with an unknown male.
- That Brennan then traveled back to California to stay with family members.
- That Brennan then traveled to Clearwater Florida at which time he began to stay with his father.
- That he [Detective Brown] spoke with Kyle Brennan's brother, Scott Brennan, on 03-02-2007 and that Scott Brennan had concerns that their father [Thomas Brennan] may have had something to do with his brother's death because his father is a Scientologist and does not believe in medications for mental illness.

Detective Brown agreed to E-mail me the narrative of the Missing Person report that was completed as well as an E-mail message that was sent to him from Kyle Brennan's brother, Scott Brennan. The following is the two e-mails that were forwarded to me by Detective Brown;

Det. Bohling,

Hear is the contact information for Kyle's brother Scott Brennan (H) 434.977.6936, (C) 434.806.7938 and the missing person narrative.

On today's date I met with Mrs. Britton, who is the mother of Kyle Brennan. She reports that her son has been under psychiatric care for over a year with Dr. Stephen McNamara. He has been diagnosed with depression and periods of delusion and paranoia. He is supposed to be on Lexipro for depression. On 11/27/06 Kyle left home while his parents were at work. He had cleaned out his bank account of approximately \$8000.00. Although he had never left like this before his mother stated they felt he might return in a couple of weeks. When Kyle still hadn't returned Mrs. Britton stated she did call the Police but was told there would have to be more information regarding Kyle's condition to enter him into NCIC as endangered.

On 01/07/07 Mrs. Britton received a call from an FBI agent (Anderson ?) from the Des Moines, IA office. He told Mrs. Britton that Kyle had walked into their office stating he was being followed and "they were after him". The FBI realized that he was delusional and in need of treatment. Kyle was wearing a

UVA baseball style cap. The agent asked him where in VA he lived and Kyle told them Charlottesville. The agent tried contacting local authorities to see if anyone fitting Kyle's description had been reported as missing. There wasn't any report on file at that time. The agent continued trying to talk with Kyle when he told them he had to leave or "they would find him". The agent asked who would they call if he got hit by a bus and Kyle gave the agent his home phone number. That is when the agent notified Mrs. Britton about her son. The agent also advised that Kyle had over \$5000.00 in cash on his person and it was apparent he wasn't eating and seemed emaciated. His mental state was deteriorated. Kyle left the office and the FBI agent told her they kept watch on him until he disappeared again.

On 01/08/07 Kyle showed up at an Aunt's residence in San Diego, CA. He stayed with this Aunt until 01/15/07. The Aunt stated he was very paranoid and kept saying "they were hunting him down". The Aunt tried to get Kyle to seek mental help and that's when he left and has not been seen or heard from since. Mrs. Britton received a Sprint cellphone bill on 01/22/07 where Kyle purchased a cellphone. The phone number is . The phone numbers he had been calling were mainly to the FBI office in Des Moines, while he was still in that area. The last call on the bill was dated 01/12/07 and that was to the Aunt's cellphone in San Diego.

Mrs. Britton fears for her son's safety as well as for those who may come in contact with him. Particularly those in an authority capacity. She has tried calling the cellphone but Kyle will not answer the call. Mrs. Britton feels that if Law Enforcement attempts to call Kyle he may throw away the phone. I also suggested Mrs. Britton see if she can contact Sprint and advise them of the situation and see if they can trace any calls made as to their location of origin. NCIC entry needed with National broadcast with last known location being in San Diego, CA. Kyle has a current passport and could possibly continue south of the border.

PREVIOUS CASE STATUS:

Active/Remains Active with submission of this supplement report.

INVESTIGATION:

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On 03-06-2007 at 1100 hours, I met with Kyle Brennan's father Thomas Brennan and Thomas Brennan's wife Wendy Brennan at 403 Pennsylvania Avenue. Thomas Brennan then advised me of the following;

- That he is divorced from Kyle's mother and currently resides in Clearwater with his wife, Wendy Brennan.
- That in 2003, Kyle moved to Leigh Acres Florida with him so to finish school.
- That Kyle graduated from school in 2004 and then moved back to Virginia to stay with his mother in December, 2004.
- That Kyle had been prescribed and began to take Lexapro in August of 2006 for symptoms of depression.
- That Kyle left home in Virginia approximately two months ago and traveled to several states on his own.
- That approximately one week prior to the incident, Kyle contacted him from San Francisco and advised that he was "Out of money".
- That he made arrangements to have Kyle fly to Tampa International Airport at which time he [Thomas] paid for the flight ticket.
- That Kyle arrived in Tampa at which time he picked him up and they went to dinner.
- That he agreed to allow Kyle to stay at his apartment located at 423 Cleveland Street
- That he and Kyle spoke of Kyle's depression and that Kyle advised him that he didn't like taking the medication that had been prescribed to him. [According to Thomas, Kyle advised him that he had not been taking his medications on a regular basis]

- That approximately one day after Kyle arrived in Florida, he [Thomas] came home and found that the door to the guest bedroom was closed. [This was the bedroom that Kyle had been sleeping in since his arrival]
- That he called out to Kyle at which time he [Kyle] answered; "I'll be right out."
- That he then learned from Kyle that he had placed furniture in front of the interior of the bedroom door.
- That Kyle did not tell him why he had done this.
- That three days prior to the incident, he and Kyle spoke and agreed that Kyle would improve his daily nutrition and stop taking the Lexapro.
- That he [Thomas Brennan] does not believe in psychiatric medication due to his religious beliefs.
- That he did not force Kyle to stop taking his medication and that the decision was a mutual agreement.
- That he then placed the Lexapro medication in his vehicle
- That for the next three days, Kyle was eating and sleeping better and appeared to be very positive.
- That the firearm utilized in this incident originally belonged to his [Thomas'] Grandfather.
- That the firearm and ammunition had been stored in his bedroom nightstand within a green army style bag
- That he never advised Kyle of the location of the firearm nor did Kyle ever speak of the firearm.
- That during the time that Kyle was staying with him, Kyle never spoke of suicide.
- That his wife was in New York during the entire time that Kyle was in Clearwater.
- That Kyle was scheduled to return back to Virginia on 02-19-2007 so to reside with his mother.

Thomas then advised me of several pages of hand written notes that belonged to Kyle. Thomas advised that Kyle brought these items with him when he arrived from California. Thomas consented to me taking the hand written notes so that I could make copies of them. I advised Thomas that I would return the notes to him on 03-07-2007.

On 03-06-2007 at approximately 1400 hours, I received a telephone call from Kyle Brennan's brother, Scott Brennan W/M, 04-02-1977. During this time, Scott advised that he did not trust his father and that he believed that his father was hiding facts of this incident from the family and the police. I inquired if Scott had any specific knowledge that would indicate criminal activity was involved in this incident. Scott advised that he was not aware of any specific facts however; he believed that his father was responsible for Kyle's death. Scott was very angry that his father would take the medications away from Kyle once he arrived in Florida. I then explained to Scott that based on the final count of the recovered medications it was evident that Kyle was not taking his medications on a regular basis or as prescribed. Scott then inquired about the following;

- If I had interviewed his father's new roommate, "Jerry".
- Why did "Jerry" notify Kyle's mother of the death.
- The family in Virginia had received Kyle's property back from Florida to include his lap-top computer. Scott advised that he had reviewed his brother's computer files and found that files had been removed from the system approximately two hours after Kyle had been located.
- That he had researched Kyle's cell phone records on line and learned that Kyle had made a call to the Clearwater Police Department on 02-05-2007. According to Scott, the call lasted for eight minutes.

Scott then advised that I could access Kyle's cell phone records on line so to review the activity that was taking place. The cell phone number was identified as [319] 504-3658 with service being provided by Sprint. I was instructed to go to the website of Sprint com and then enter into the Personal wireless section. The user name was identified as _____ The password was identified as _____. I advised Scott that I would follow-up on these areas of concern with his father on 03-07-2007. I also advised that he would need to make arrangements to have the computer sent to the Clearwater Police Department so that I could have the proper review completed. Scott advised that he would have the computer shipped to me. **It should be noted that this was the first knowledge of Kyle Brennan being in possession of a computer upon his arrival to Clearwater**

On 03-06-2007 at approximately 1530 hours, I copied and reviewed the hand written documents that were provided to me by Thomas Brennan. There were a total of 38 hand written pages that document Kyle's concern and anger towards members of his family, police corruption and persons that he had contact with in school. Please see documents for additional information. I have forwarded copies to the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office Property and Evidence Section for future reference.

On 03-07-2007 at approximately 0920 hours, I met with Thomas and Wendy Brennan at 403 Pennsylvania Avenue. At this time, I gave the original hand written documents back to Thomas. I then spoke Thomas about the computer that he had mailed back to the family in Virginia after Kyle's death. Thomas advised that he did not review, remove or alter any files within Kyle's lap-top computer.

Regarding the phone call being made to Kyle's mother from "Jerry", Thomas advised that he asked his close friend, Jerry Gentile, to contact Victoria Britton and advise her of the incident because he was too distraught to speak with anyone. Thomas advised that on 02-17-2007, he called Gentile after calling his Chaplain Denise and the police and requested that Gentile respond to the apartment for support. Thomas advised that Gentile has never resided at the apartment on Cleveland Street. Thomas confirmed that Gentile was at the residence when the Officers arrived at his apartment on 02-17-2007.

Pursuant to Section 119 071(5)(b), Florida Statutes, information revealing the personal assets of a crime victim, which were not involved in the crime, is exempt from and not subject to public inspection

Thomas confirmed that he did have a friend staying at his apartment prior to Kyle arriving in Clearwater whom he identified as Eddy Childers. Thomas advised that he assisted Childers for a brief time and that Childers had moved out of the apartment prior to Kyle's arrival. Thomas confirmed that some of Childers' personal belongings were still in the guest bedroom at the time of this incident [This was the bedroom that Kyle had been sleeping in since his arrival]

On 03-08-2007 at approximately 1415 hours, I made a written request to the Police Communications Center regarding the call that was placed by Kyle to the Clearwater Police Department on 02-07-2007. I requested a recording of this call so that I could review the content.

On 03-12-2007 at 0900 hours, I received and reviewed the recording that was requested of the Clearwater Police Department Communications Center. I reviewed the recording and noted that Kyle speaks of concern for his own safety. Kyle advised that he believed that his family may be trying to harm and/or kill him. Kyle advised that he wanted to place the call in the event that anything ever happened to him. Kyle also speaks of previously meeting the Sheriff in Clearwater and that the Sheriff appeared as though he would help him [Kyle Brennan] with his situation. Kyle speaks of the fact that he was trying to improve his life and had been through a difficult time. Kyle confirmed that he was calling from Hawaii and was planning on moving to Clearwater soon. During the recording, Kyle does not speak of any specific person who may bring harm to him. This recording will be forwarded to the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office Property and Evidence Section for future reference.

On 03-21-2007 at approximately 1530 hours, I received and reviewed the 911 Transfer call that I had requested for this incident. The original will be forwarded to the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office Property and Evidence Section for future reference.

On 04-05-2007 at approximately 0930 hours, I obtained a voice-mail message from Kyle Brennan's

mother, Victoria Britton that was date/time stamped for 04-05-2007 @ 0913 hours. The telephone call originated from [434] 973-7927. I also noted that Victoria Britton had called two times on 04-04-2007 however; I was out of the office and in training on this date.

On 04-05-2007 at approximately 1005 hours, I returned the call to Victoria Britton and provided an update for this investigation. Britton spoke of wanting Thomas Brennan charged with a crime because of the fact that he had left a firearm within the residence when Kyle arrived in Clearwater. I explained the statute requirements under the following Florida State Statutes;

- F.S.S. 790.17: Furnishing weapons to minors under 18 years of age or persons of unsound mind and furnishing firearms to minors under 18 years of age prohibited. Within this section, the law prohibits selling, hiring, bartering, lending, transferring or giving any minor under 18 years of age any dirk, electric weapon or device or other weapon, other than an ordinary pocketknife, without permission of the minor's parent or guardian, or selling, hiring, bartering, lending, transferring or giving to any person of unsound mind an electric weapon or device or any dangerous weapon, other than an ordinary pocketknife. Due to the fact that; 1] Kyle Brennan was twenty [20] years of age at the time of this incident and; 2]The firearm was not provided to him, this statute does not apply.

- F.S.S. 790.174: Safe Storage of Firearms Required. Within this section, the law pertains to the proper storage and security of a firearm so that minors, under the age of sixteen [16], will not have access. Due to Kyle Brennan's adult age at the time of this incident, this statute does not apply.

During this conversation with Victoria Britton, she advised that Kyle's condition was poor when he arrived in Florida. Britton believed that Thomas Brennan knew that Kyle was suicidal and that he should not have allowed a firearm to remain within the residence. Britton advised that Thomas Brennan wanted to send Kyle to Narc-Anon for treatment however; he then contacted her on 02-16-2007 and advised her that Kyle would need to leave his apartment and return to Virginia.

I advised Britton that I had no evidence within this investigation to suggest that foul play was involved. I also advised Britton that I would have Kyle's computer evaluated once it was sent back to me from Virginia.

On 04-06-2007 at approximately 0900 hours, I received a telephone call from Kyle's Step-Father, Rick Britton. Rick Britton was equally concerned at the fact that Thomas Brennan would not be charged criminally for this event. I explained the facts and circumstances of the incident and reiterated the fact that there was no evidence suggesting criminal intent. At this time, Rick Britton advised that he was concerned about the fact that files had been deleted from Kyle's computer immediately after the report of his death. I advised Britton that the family would need to ship the computer to the Clearwater Police Department so that I could have the proper evaluation completed by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. Britton advised that he would make arrangements to ship the computer to my office.

On 04-25-2007 at approximately 0830 hours, I obtained a voice-mail message from Rick Britton that was date/Time stamped for 04-24-2007 @ 1558 hours. The original call came from telephone number [434] 923-0786. Within the message, Britton requested that I contact him as he was making arrangements to bring Kyle's computer to Florida.

I have received and reviewed the District Six Medical Examiner's Office Report of Autopsy for this investigation. I noted the following results;

The Report of Autopsy has been forwarded to the Clearwater Police Department Records Section so to be added to the original case file.

INVESTIGATIVE CONCLUSION:

The investigation revealed that Kyle Brennan had been exhibiting early signs of Schizophrenia to include paranoia and delusions and that Lexapro had been prescribed. Kyle's doctor, Dr. McNamera advised that Lexapro should be administered on a long term and regular basis in order to attain the proper results. The investigation revealed that Kyle was not taking his medication as prescribed. This was confirmed during the original investigation at which time a count of the Lexapro pills was completed. Dr. McNamera also advised that he was not aware of any major side effects if one was to suddenly stop taking the medication Lexapro.

During the investigation, Kyle's father Thomas Brennan was cooperative with Investigators and provided information as requested. At this time, there is no evidence to suggest that Thomas Brennan withheld pertinent information and/or acted with any criminal intent. I have advised the family that I would have Kyle Brennan's computer evaluated at the Florida Department of Law Enforcement however; I have not yet received this item.

At this time, the status of this investigation will be changed from Active to Inactive. Once Kyle's computer is received from the family, I will make the proper arrangements to have it evaluated by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement Computer Section.

On 04-21-2008, I met with Detective Will Smith and requested that he attempt to retrieve any and all information, photographs and videos from Kyle Brennan's cell phone for this investigation. Detective Smith forensically reviewed the cell phone and copied the results onto compact disks. Please see Detective Smith's supplement report for additional information

On 05-07-2008, Detective Smith provided Kyle Brennan's cell phone back to me as well as the compact disks with the forensic report results of his findings. I have printed out copies of the HTML Forensic Toolkit 2.0 report and the PDF Forensic Toolkit 2.0 report which have been included within the original case file. I have also printed out copies of the photographs that were retrieved from the cell phone and included them in the original case file. The compact disks that were provided to me by Detective Smith regarding the Forensic review of the cell phone have been included in the original case file. DET. BOHLING: So he called your residence or did he call your wife's cell phone? Do you recall?

G. GENTILE: I think it was my wife's cell phone. Pretty sure.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. 'Cause I mean, obviously with him doing handyman work, they, you know, know each other pretty well.

DET. BOHLING: Right.

G. GENTILE: Um, yeah, so we went down there and he had, uh, you know, walked up -- I didn't know where he lived but when I went down to the area -- uh, it's around the Starbucks, uh, just down the --

DET. BOHLING: Down town here?

G. GENTILE: -- down right here.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Um, there was a lot of, uh, police there. So I walked into the building that was behind -- think it was behind the Starbucks --

DET. BOHLING: Uh-huh.

G. GENTILE: -- and started walking up the stairs and he was standing outside, I think, talking to an officer. So --

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: -- I just --

DET. BOHLING: And you went with your wife to that location?

G. GENTILE: No, just me. I just jumped in the car and went down and --

DET. BOHLING: So you went -- okay.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Now -- so when you arrive, you definitely see police cars that are there?

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: And you see Tom speaking with an officer?

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: You're absolutely positive of that, that you arrived before the police arrived?

G. GENTILE: No, no, no, no. Not before the police. No, no, no. They were --

DET. BOHLING: I mean, I'm sorry, that you arrived after the police arrived?

G. GENTILE: Oh, yeah. Absolutely.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: No question about that.

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DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Uh, there was -- there was a whole bunch of people. When I was -- actually, there was an officer there and when I walked up the stairs he said, "What are you doing here?" And I said, "Well, I got my friend Tom upstairs that, you know, just called and something happened. We don't know what happened." So I said, you know, "Can I see him?" or whatever.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: And he said, "Well, he's --" I think he was inside the apartment and he was walking out with an officer. And he said, "Well, if he's outside you can. You can't go near the place." I said --

DET. BOHLING: Right.

G. GENTILE: -- "Okay, fine."

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: So --

DET. BOHLING: Did anybody else come with you at that point in time when you went to Tom's?

G. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: You definitely arrived by yourself?

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Um, do you recall -- going back a little bit here, do you recall what time approximately the call came in from Tom to your wife?

G. GENTILE: It -- it was really late. It would have been after I arrived, obviously on a flight and I was home. Um, after 11, maybe 12. It -- it was late. I actually don't -- I definitely don't recall the time.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. It was definitely, though -- obviously you took a late flight in that night to get home?

G. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah. You can probably figure it out, certainly, you know, investigate my wife's cell phone records or something, figure it out.

DET. BOHLING: Right. Okay. And -- all right. So you go to the scene and I would take it that eventually you were able to make contact with Tom.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Once you got there.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Can you discuss that with me what happened? Do you remember what you guys talked about? What he said? Uh --

G. GENTILE: Um, it was actually a little hard to understand 'cause he was crying a lot. Um, he just said "I don't know --" like, "I don't know what happened. You know, my son shot himself and -- and he's gone." So there was an officer actually interviewing Tom at the time.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: So I was just kind of listening to that. He and I didn't talk.

DET. BOHLING: All right. Yeah.

G. GENTILE: Um, he was just, you know, talking to the officer and the officer was asking him, you know, questions about what happened and --

DET. BOHLING: Right.

G. GENTILE: -- he was trying to recall when he got there and that kind of thing. Um, after the interview Tom came downstairs and I remember him saying he needed to smoke a cigarette. He smoked a cigarette and he was just in, you know, total grief. He said, "I can't figure out how this could have happened." So that's pretty much the whole thing. I was just trying to find a way to comfort him, "Is there something I can do? Do you need a place to go?"

DET. BOHLING: Right.

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G. GENTILE: Like, whatever. So we just stayed there a little while and then, uh, I guess, you know, that was it. You know, he --

DET. BOHLING: Do you recall how long you actually stayed there with him or --

G. GENTILE: You know, might have been maybe a half-hour. Wasn't a -- wasn't a real long time but

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Did Tom mention anything specific to you about what happened or anything that he observed when he went into the apartment that night?

G. GENTILE: No. Just -- I mean, when I was standing there when he was talking to the officer, he had said -- I think he -- I could be mistaken but I think he said that his son was, um, in, like, a bedroom or something and there was a gun there. And he had had a gun, um, in -- in his house so he -- had for a long time from his dad or something like that and --

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: -- and he couldn't remember that he even had it. Um, but he didn't really talk to me, you know, about what happened.

DET. BOHLING: He didn't give you any specific facts about what he saw when he walked in the apartment that night or --

G. GENTILE: Not for me, no. I didn't ask.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: I didn't ask that.

DET. BOHLING: And he didn't volunteer it?

G. GENTILE: No. No, he was -- just kept saying over and over, "He's gone. He's dead." And he was, you know, really upset and crying a lot.

DET. BOHLING: What about Tom's wife that he was married to at that time?

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: Now, as far as I know. Was she there? Did you see her anywhere?

G. GENTILE: Uh, no --

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: -- I don't recall seeing her. I think she was out of town. I think she was in New York with her parents or something like that. I -- I don't believe that she was in town.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. So at any time that you were there that night when you came and met with Tom, at any time did you go into the apartment?

G. GENTILE: No, no, no. There was -- like I said, the police were already there and I'd got to the, um, one of the stair landings and that was as far as I could go. So --

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: -- never got near it.

DET. BOHLING: Now, do you know, when Tom had actually called to -- to your wife that night -- and it's probably early morning hours, actually, at that time.

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: Um, any specific reason that you would know why Tom would call your wife first prior to contacting anybody else?

G. GENTILE: Um, I guess just friends. I mean, as far as I know -- I mean, I don't know what Tom's group of friends really are -- 'cause I -- I don't think he's come from this area.

DET. BOHLING: Uh-huh.

G. GENTILE: They live from somewhere else. Um, just a friend.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Is -- and it's -- what it's probably gonna come down to, I'll probably need to speak with your wife, as well.

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

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NARRATIVE

NARRATIVE (Cont.)

DET BOHLING: Um, but is there any -- do you have any knowledge that -- is Denise like a chaplain

--

G. GENTILE: No.

DET BOHLING: -- to -- to Tom or a person that -- that Tom would contact because she's a church member, whether he trusts her or there's some type of protocol? I don't know But is she a chaplain to him or --

G. GENTILE: I don't think so.

DET BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Um, I'm not even sure what that means but --

DET BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Okay. Uh --

DET BOHLING: And I just -- I know it -- again, I don't mean to throw on oddball question at you, but these are things that have come up.

G. GENTILE: Okay.

DET BOHLING: And obviously there's some concern as to why would contact Denise first as compared to contacting 911 first

G. GENTILE: Oh.

DET BOHLING: Everybody has -- everybody has different reasons --

G. GENTILE: Yeah

DET BOHLING: -- for why they do things.

G. GENTILE: I'm not even sure it actually happened that way 'Cause --

DET BOHLING: Well, that was gonna be my next question Do you know that to be the case or not?

G. GENTILE: I don't know. But I don't -- I -- I couldn't even imagine that would have done that.

DET BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: I mean, there's no -- if -- if you're asking if there's some protocol in the church that she would call -- he would call, like, a friend or whatever, no.

DET BOHLING: Okay

G. GENTILE: Yeah, nothing like that I -- I would have thought would have called 911

DET BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: As I would have done if it was me. So --

DET BOHLING: Right. And, you know -- but we find that in several investigations that you work -- and I'm sure in your life when you deal with people --

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET BOHLING: -- people react very differently --

G. GENTILE: Yeah

DET BOHLING: -- under extreme circumstances.

G. GENTILE: Yeah Yeah

DET BOHLING: Especially when adrenaline is high and stress is high.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET BOHLING: So you know, again, that's -- this is one of those things where I ask about to the people that were there --

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET BOHLING: -- you being one of them --

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET BOHLING: -- that might offer some assistance and direction --

Section 365.171(12), F. S. Any record revealing name, address, telephone number or personal information obtained by an agency, which may identify person requesting E911 is confidential and exempt

G. GENTILE: Sure.

DET. BOHLING: -- that way.

G. GENTILE: Sure.

DET. BOHLING: And you know, Tom himself has -- has told us, "Yes, I did contact Denise," but there was some mention of possibly a chaplain or something to that effect. And I -- again, I'll -- I'll probably ask Denise that, as well.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: If she's willing to speak with me.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah. I don't think -- I don't know why she wouldn't be. I do -- actually, I do remember, uh, when the -- the other officer was interviewing Tom, I remember Tom saying that, uh -- I was trying to remember some of the things that came back. He said when he got to the house after -- I think he was working that day -- he couldn't get in the door and he tried to push the door open. And he, like, really pushed it, I think, and then he could smell, like -- you know, like gunfire smoke or something like that. And that's -- I remember -- just remembering some of the parts of the conversation coming back that --

DET. BOHLING: That -- that he was telling the officer?

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. When he was being interviewed. So --like you said, it's been a long time so --

DET. BOHLING: It has.

G. GENTILE: -- (unintelligible) bits and pieces are coming --

DET. BOHLING: Yeah, it's been a little over a year now.

G. GENTILE: I think I actually wrote the officer's name down somewhere so I probably have it.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: If we need to find it.

DET. BOHLING: Now, was there a time -- did Tom request that you make a phone call to anybody that night after all this --

G. GENTILE: Yes.

DET. BOHLING: -- had happened?

G. GENTILE: Yes.

DET. BOHLING: Can you explain that to me?

G. GENTILE: Yeah. So he -- he was downstairs, uh, when he was smoking a cigarette and his hands were shaking, uh, really bad. And he said, "I can't dial my phone." And I even asked him, "Do you want me to do any -- is there, like, anything I can help out with?" And he said, "I can't even dial my phone." And I said, "Is there someone you need to call?" He goes, "I need to call, uh, his mom and -- and say," you know, "what happened."

DET. BOHLING: Uh-huh.

G. GENTILE: So I said, you know, "Can I do that?" And -- and he was really hard to understand so I said, okay, I would do that. And I dialed the -- you know, he had to tell me where the number was in his phone. Dialed the phone. Um, his -- I think it was either the -- either a man or woman answered. I can't remember. Uh, and I had asked -- I think it was the woman that answered and I asked, "Is --" I can't remember her name but, um, "Is this so-and-so?" And I said -- and she said, "Yes." And I said, "Well, ma'am, I -- I have a -- some bad news, um, to give you. I think your son has hurt himself tonight and, um, I don't think he survived." And she obviously went into grief. Um, and then a man got on the phone and he said, "Who is this?" And I said, "Well, I'm a friend of Tom's. I came down. Uh, Tom is standing beside me and he can't -- you know, he's, like, not coherent. But, um, apparently Kyle found a gun in the house

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and committed suicide and he's not here anymore " And he said -- uh, he kind of had a mean voice and he said, you know, "What are you doing here?" And I said, "Well, you know, you need to talk to Tom " So handed the phone to Tom. I --

DET. BOHLING: Did Tom speak to anybody?

G. GENTILE: I don't think he did. I think the guy hung up. I think -- yeah, there was no one -- there was nothing on the other line. He couldn't get it. And I think after that, um, Tom called, like, his sister or something like that. There was another relative/member that he called and he just, you know, went into grief. And I, you know, again, said, "Tom, is there something I can do to help?"

DET. BOHLING: Now, at any time that -- when you were there with Tom before you left him, uh, did you recall him receiving any additional calls on his cell phone, the phone ringing or anything like that?

G. GENTILE: No. I don't recall.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Actually, I don't recall. I think he was trying to get ahold of his wife. That's why I remember she wasn't in the area. I think she was in New York. I think he was trying to -- had been trying to get ahold of, uh, his wife.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Okay. We -- the situation involving the computer.

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: Now, obviously, just meeting you and understanding, obviously, you're probably pretty well versed in computers and you're very computer literate?

G. GENTILE: Reasonably. Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Somewhat.

DET. BOHLING: 'Cause there's a lot of us out here that aren't and I'm one of them.

G. GENTILE: Okay.

DET. BOHLING: But, um, there was some concern about a computer --

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: -- that belonged to Kyle. Can you just explain that to me?

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: How you --

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: -- you know, became aware --

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: -- of that?

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Did it come up the first night or --

G. GENTILE: No. It didn't come up the first night. Uh, the next day, um, I think Tom had been in communication with Denise, had maybe talked on the phone, uh, and said, you know, there's -- Kyle has a computer. I think it was in his -- maybe a backpack or something. Had a computer. He said the same thing. "I'm not computer literate. Um, I know your husband is. Can you just take a look at it and see if there's anything on there that would help me understand what happened?"

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: So the laptop got dropped off, uh, somewhere at my house. I was out during the day. It was on a Saturday. Uh, came home, the laptop was on the counter or something.

DET. BOHLING: Are you sure it was the very next day? You feel comfortable with that?

G. GENTILE: Yeah. I actually wrote down the day.

DET. BOHLING: Oh, okay. Good.

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G. GENTILE: Yeah, yeah.

DET. BOHLING: All right.

G. GENTILE: It was definitely the next day.

DET. BOHLING: And who picked that computer up from Tom? Do you know?

G. GENTILE: I think it was, um, Denise's daughter Taylor. I think she, uh, went over to the apartment with Tom to help clean up, uh, whatever was there.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: And I believe it was from her. I wasn't at the house when the laptop came so I'm not real sure.

DET. BOHLING: All right. What's Denise's daughter's name?

G. GENTILE: Taylor.

DET. BOHLING: Taylor. And how old is she?

G. GENTILE: She is 20 -- let me think -- 22 now, I believe.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. So both Denise and Taylor, you believe, went over to the apartment the next day?

G. GENTILE: I don't know if Denise did. I think Taylor -- I think Tom asked Taylor or something like that to --

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: -- to help -- you know, would she be willing to help out. I don't think he --

DET. BOHLING: So obviously Tom knows Taylor, then?

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: I mean, it wouldn't -- it wasn't like that was the first time they met or anything?

G. GENTILE: Yeah. Like I said, Tom's been over our house for Thanksgiving --

DET. BOHLING: Right.

G. GENTILE: -- and that kind of stuff, so --

DET. BOHLING: Okay. All right. So you come home, then, on that Saturday.

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: And the computer is there.

G. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. If you could take me from that point, then. What -- what goes on next?

G. GENTILE: So opened up the computer, turned it on. Um, I went to his -- typically in a PC there's a directory called My Documents.

DET. BOHLING: Uh-huh.

G. GENTILE: So I went to the My Documents directory, you know, saw there were some files there. Um, wasn't many. It was, like, three or four. And then there were some pictures and that kind of thing. And I noticed that the files -- uh, there were, I think, three files there and they were in a program called Microsoft Works. So it's just like a -- a Word document program. Um, what I was attempting to do is just take the files and open them and print them. The laptop didn't have a printer driver to connect to my kind of printer.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: So I needed to convert -- and I -- I can't read -- I can't open files from Microsoft Works in any computers that I have. So I had to convert the file format to one that I could read.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: So when I opened up the computer, the wrong file format was there. I went to convert them. I put, like, a thumb drive, which is like a little drive that you stick in the back of a computer. It's like a memory stick.

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DET BOHLING: Uh-huh.

G. GENTILE: Uh, and I copied the files on to the memory stick. And then I was gonna use them in my computer, convert them. I did all that. Um, what I found was by mistake, when I put the thumb drive back on the computer, I copied the files on to Kyle's computer and said, Well, this is probably not a good thing. So the ones that I --

DET BOHLING: So they just -- they copied and moved in to another spot on the computer, on Kyle's laptop?

G. GENTILE: The files -- well, the conversion files that I made so that I could print them on my printer ended up on this memory stick. And when I put it back in, my six-year-old daughter was, you know, doing some stuff with me. She was -- wants to play and that kind of thing and I just wasn't paying attention to what I was doing. The files that I made that were converted, I copied on to Kyle's -- uh, Kyle's laptop by mistake.

DET BOHLING: Okay. So they got copied back on.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET BOHLING: And probably placed in another location somewhere on it.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET BOHLING: Okay. I gotcha.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. And then I realized that mistake I made so those files I erased. So those -- I had heard somewhere from Tom that some people were upset that I erased files on the computer. I said, "Wait a minute. This is not -- that's not how this happened."

DET BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: So I actually have a copy of everything that was on the computer and the files that I had put on by mistake. I actually made a copy of that. So --

DET BOHLING: Okay. Well, and I appreciate you bringing that. It -- it's -- based on what you're saying, it's safe to say that files got copied on to Kyle's computer; however, it wasn't anything new that you had changed.

G. GENTILE: No, no, no.

DET BOHLING: It was -- it was files that were already on there.

G. GENTILE: No.

DET BOHLING: You were attempting to take it to another system so you could copy it in a format that your computer would recognize.

G. GENTILE: For the purpose of printing.

DET BOHLING: For the purpose of printing.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET BOHLING: And then it gets put back on Kyle's computer in error but just in a different location.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET BOHLING: Does that sound about right?

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET BOHLING: For a guy that's kind of computer illiterate like me?

G. GENTILE: Yes.

DET BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah.

DET BOHLING: Now, you're absolutely positive that you didn't delete anything on that computer that, uh -- purposely or otherwise --

G. GENTILE: I absolutely --

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DET. BOHLING: -- to -- to help Tom out?
G. GENTILE: -- did not delete anything on that computer.
DET. BOHLING: Okay.
G. GENTILE: And as I had indicated when I heard that this was going on, there are computer program that you can get that can look at a disk. And even if one deleted a file, you can't actually ever delete a file
DET. BOHLING: That's correct.
G. GENTILE: You can scan the disk and you can look at whatever's there.
DET. BOHLING: Yes, sir
G. GENTILE: I said, "So if anybody even thinks that I did that, I know that this stuff exists and you can go find whatever you think was done."
DET. BOHLING: Right.
G. GENTILE: Um, so that's what I suggested. I -- you know, when Tom had mentioned that someone was upset, I said, "Look, this is what somebody has to do."
DET. BOHLING: So that's how you found out about the whole computer thing, through Tom?
G. GENTILE: Yeah.
DET. BOHLING: Afterwards?
G. GENTILE: Yeah
DET. BOHLING: Okay.
G. GENTILE: Yeah.
DET. BOHLING: All right. So what happens next, then? You still have the computer. You realize what has happened. Um, take me from there at that point in time where you're -- you still have the computer. I -- did you make any copies for him? Or were you able to print anything out for Tom?
G. GENTILE: Yeah. I printed out the -- the files that were on there. I put them in a folder like this.
DET. BOHLING: Okay.
G. GENTILE: And said, "Here you go." And I have, you know --
DET. BOHLING: Could I take a look at that?
G. GENTILE: Yeah, sure.
DET. BOHLING: Is it all right?
G. GENTILE: Yeah, yeah. So I can kind of -- it's -- it's probably easy to -- to explain then.
DET. BOHLING: Yeah, I appreciate that. 'Cause I'm not that good at this stuff
G. GENTILE: Yeah. That's fine
DET. BOHLING: I can get through the basics but --
G. GENTILE: See if I can find my glasses here 'cause I can't see without them.
DET. BOHLING: That's one nice thing about law enforcement is we have different professionals that specialize in all this stuff.
G. GENTILE: Yeah.
DET. BOHLING: And they've been helping me out by --
G. GENTILE: Yeah. So --
DET. BOHLING: I've actually learned quite a bit
G. GENTILE: So here -- all the files with the date of the 18th --
DET. BOHLING: Uh-huh.
G. GENTILE: -- were Word document files that I made that were copies from these Works program files.
DET. BOHLING: Is that what WPS stands for?
G. GENTILE: Yeah. Well, I -- I don't know --
DET. BOHLING: Is --

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G. GENTILE: This is a -- an -- uh, a file type of Microsoft Works.

DET. BOHLING: Gotcha.

G. GENTILE: Which is the free software that came on his laptop --

DET. BOHLING: All right.

G. GENTILE: -- that he had.

DET. BOHLING: All right.

G. GENTILE: So this "Weekly Schedule," "Kyle's Monthly Food" and "Battle Plan," those were the other three files that I had seen in this area. This is under My Documents.

DET. BOHLING: Uh-huh.

G. GENTILE: And I needed to convert them to DOC, which are Microsoft Word formats, so I can print them.

DET. BOHLING: Yeah.

G. GENTILE: So you can see the dates of when he last saved the file here.

DET. BOHLING: Uh-huh.

G. GENTILE: Those are the dates that -- that he did. And you can see all the conversion about 3:00 in the afternoon, um, when I did these. So this is when I converted and -- and put them back on his computer by mistake, was -- was these times.

DET. BOHLING: Those times? Those are the times --

G. GENTILE: Yeah. So these are the three files, and then I printed them here. From my computer, I printed these. So these .DOC files are the three that I printed.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Which are just conversions from these WPS types that are his.

DET. BOHLING: Gotcha.

G. GENTILE: This certificate PDF is -- is in here, as well. And that is -- I know the pictures may be somewhere in here. It's like a -- that was that. I guess he must have had a traffic ticket or something like that.

DET. BOHLING: LowestPriceTrafficSchool.com.

G. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: And it has his name and his -- the address of 423 Cleveland Street, Apartment 4.

Okay.

G. GENTILE: Right. And this is when, I guess, he completed it and all that. So --

DET. BOHLING: Date of completion, 8/18/2006.

G. GENTILE: Right. So that's this one here. And you can see it's actually -- the date matches, right?

DET. BOHLING: 8/18/2006, yes, it does.

G. GENTILE: So --

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: -- this is what was there.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: All this stuff. So the mistake I made was I copied this -- these .DOC files on to his computer by mistake.

DET. BOHLING: Uh-huh.

G. GENTILE: Those are the ones that I erased, were things that I did by mistake.

DET. BOHLING: Right. But you erased -- you didn't erase them out of the computer. You --

G. GENTILE: I just deleted them.

DET. BOHLING: You deleted the -- the doubles of it.

G. GENTILE: Yes. Yeah.

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DET. BOHLING: Okay. I think I understand what you're saying

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: I see the -- there's a picture in here, as well, (unintelligible)?

G. GENTILE: Yeah, if you go into this -- in -- into this My Pictures directory, there's --

DET. BOHLING: Uh-huh.

G. GENTILE: -- actually some pictures So what he had in there -- this is -- this is basically printout. it looks like he scanned, um -- I don't know -- some -- must have been, like, bank accounts.

DET. BOHLING: Yes, from Wachovia Bank?

G. GENTILE: From Wachovia. And then there was this picture, that picture. I -- I'm assuming this is him. I've never met him. Right? So, uh -- and then these two So this is what I gave Tom This is what he had asked me for so this is the stuff that I gave him

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: My printer's not great at printing pictures but --

DET. BOHLING: Actually, it's not too bad at all. Now, I had received -- let's see if it's in here -- from -- from Tom some other documents. I don't see it in here at all. Let me -- let me pull it out of my files --

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: -- see if it looks familiar to you. Just give me a minute to pull this out here.

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh

DET. BOHLING: Make sure I have the right thing. Actually, what I think I'll do, I'll match up what I do have.

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: This is one here that's listed as "Food for Month," and I think I saw that in there.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: There it is, "Food for Month," "Food Surplus for Month of December 1st."

G. GENTILE: And I think there was a couple of pages, if I'm not mistaken, in that one.

DET. BOHLING: Yeah, there is. You're right. Here it is here.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Goes to day 10 Okay. So -- so it looks like a total of three pages for that one.

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: One, two, three. I do have that.

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: The "Weekly To-do Schedule" you have, as well

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: That's a one-page document.

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: And I saw that, too. It --

G. GENTILE: Yeah. (Unintelligible).

DET. BOHLING: -- starts off as "Already Launched."

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: Now, I notice on the one that I have as compared to the one you have --

G. GENTILE: This is my writing

DET. BOHLING: This is your writing?

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Where it talks about "File," "Battle Plan," "Last Dated." So you actually took the dates and times --

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G. GENTILE: Uh-huh
DET. BOHLING: -- when it was created?
G. GENTILE: Right.
DET. BOHLING: Last dated and then created.
G. GENTILE: Yeah. If you open up -- like, in any file that's there, there's a thing called "Properties" -
DET. BOHLING: Uh-huh.
G. GENTILE: -- you can look at. So you can -- it'll tell you the date the file was created and the last date, presumably, the file was saved.
DET. BOHLING: Okay.
G. GENTILE: So those are the -- this is my writing and what I had given Tom.
DET. BOHLING: And it's "Already Launched," and it looks like it's at least three pages on that
That's what that is, three pages?
G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.
DET. BOHLING: Okay. Now, there's one additional one here --
G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.
DET. BOHLING: -- that appears to be -- now, does that one look familiar?
G. GENTILE: Yeah.
DET. BOHLING: The note that you wrote to him?
G. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah.
DET. BOHLING: Okay.
G. GENTILE: Yeah. So this is --
DET. BOHLING: That's definitely your --
G. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah. When I had heard that this was going on I said, "Look, this is --" you know, "Here's what happened." I don't know I had heard that there was some accusation that files were created and I said, "Well, this doesn't make sense."
DET. BOHLING: Okay.
G. GENTILE: I said, "Here's how it happened," and that's basically what I described to you.
DET. BOHLING: Yeah I was just gonna say -- and basically, 'cause I am familiar with that letter, what's in that letter is everything you pretty much just got done explaining to me.
G. GENTILE: Yeah.
DET. BOHLING: Okay.
G. GENTILE: Yeah.
DET. BOHLING: That's definitely your letter, though?
G. GENTILE: I had forgotten about that, but yeah.
DET. BOHLING: Okay. Now, do you have any concerns if I maintain these documents so that I can compare them?
G. GENTILE: I brought them for you
DET. BOHLING: If you need copies of them, I have no problem making a copy for you, but I wanna be able to show that, like, what we just went through: I lined up the documents, said, Yeah, we have that one. We have that one. And they're definitely the same ones that -- that you provided to him?
G. GENTILE: Yeah.
DET. BOHLING: You're okay with that?
G. GENTILE: Yeah.
DET. BOHLING: All right.
G. GENTILE: I'm okay with that.
DET. BOHLING: Okay. That's separate. And actually, I -- I really do appreciate you bringing these

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down Um, I don't recall if I have any of these other ones that are in here, though, the photos that are there

--

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: -- with the Wachovia Bank savings account statement.

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: And for some reason I think I do recall seeing them but I'm gonna have to look further into that.

G. GENTILE: Okay. Yeah, I mean, look, I'm -- I'm here to just tell you what happened

DET. BOHLING: No. And --

G. GENTILE: And I have nothing that I'm planning to hide or --

DET. BOHLING: And I appreciate that. Believe me. I do. And I can assure you that the entire family of Kyle would expect nothing less.

G. GENTILE: Yeah, right.

DET. BOHLING: Just like if it was me in this position or you in this position.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: You'd want everybody to cooperate.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: And I can't find any reason up to this point in time that you're not cooperating.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Um, I -- I will be honest. I became a little bit concerned at first when I couldn't get in touch with you.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: I was a little concerned. I was like, "Well --" and you can understand why the family of Kyle would be --

G. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: -- concerned --

G. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: -- as well. But part of the issue that I had was I was dealing with Tom's attorney

--

G. GENTILE: Okay.

DET. BOHLING: -- where I couldn't really go directly through Tom at that time

G. GENTILE: Right

DET. BOHLING: That's when I started to reach out. I even came to your house one day and left a card.

G. GENTILE: Okay. Okay.

DET. BOHLING: Do you recall a business card showing up at your house?

G. GENTILE: I -- I don't, uh, to be honest, but I'm not home too much so it -- it's hard

DET. BOHLING: Yeah. And I'm -- and I'm finding that out. I'm --

G. GENTILE: Got a lot of kids, you know --

DET. BOHLING: Yes.

G. GENTILE: -- and they kind of come and go and --

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Now --

G. GENTILE: I -- I had -- I mean, I wasn't avoiding you or anything like that. So --

DET. BOHLING: Well, you made that clear once we -- excuse me, once we spoke on the phone.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: And then I better understood the kind -- the type of travel activity that you actually

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put in.

G. GENTILE: Right Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Excuse me. Now, are there any other documents that you're aware of that were printed out or anything that -- else that you have that you haven't provided or you're afraid to provide or anything like that?

G. GENTILE: Absolutely not. I have nothing else. That -- that other file that I printed and gave to Tom on -- on that, I'd forgotten about that one. I -- I may have that somewhere but --

DET. BOHLING: Which is the letter that you wrote to me explaining --

G. GENTILE: The letter. Yeah. Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: After you heard there were some concerns?

G. GENTILE: Yes.

DET. BOHLING: All right.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. I think his lawyer contacted me and said, you know -- you know, asked me some questions about what it was. I explained the same thing to him.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Um, so --

DET. BOHLING: Was that, uh, Mr. Johnson, Paul Johnson? Does that sound about right?

G. GENTILE: Might be, yeah. To be honest, it's a long time ago. So --

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: -- I've never even -- never met him. It was an over-the-phone conversation.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Now, do you recall what -- what the date of that actual letter was that you wrote to Tom and explained all these things that you did, Hey, I didn't delete anything. If anybody wants to know anything, here it is. Here's how you access it?

G. GENTILE: No. But --

DET. BOHLING: 'Cause I don't think there's a date on that letter.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. I -- I don't, actually, but if -- I'm sure if I have it on my computer, it will be dated you know, like I indicated here. So --

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: -- I could find the date if you need that.

DET. BOHLING: If you could, that would be great.

G. GENTILE: Okay.

DET. BOHLING: And maybe you could just give me a phone call --

G. GENTILE: I could do that.

DET. BOHLING: -- and, uh, provide that just so I can say --

G. GENTILE: Uh, let me get your card, though, so I can --

DET. BOHLING: Oh, yeah. I'll definitely give you one when we're --

G. GENTILE: Okay.

DET. BOHLING: -- we're done here. No doubt.

G. GENTILE: All right. I can do that.

DET. BOHLING: When was the last time you spoke with Tom?

G. GENTILE: It was, I think, shortly after that, uh, I think he moved to New York. Um, I don't think actually talked to Tom again after that night, that I recall.

DET. BOHLING: Really?

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: You -- you never spoke to him about the computer direct? I mean, other than -- I take it that was an e-mail that you sent Tom, that letter?

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NARRATIVE

NARRATIVE (Cont.)

G. GENTILE: I think I printed it. It might have been -- man -- it might have been from Wendy, his wife. Um, you know, I actually don't recall.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: I -- you know, Tom, like I said, only -- I knew from coming over for Thanksgiving and kind of thing, so I really didn't have regular conversations. I might have talked to him on the cell phone. I'm sure. I could have. But I -- I do not, um -- actually, I think I did. Because I believe he borrowed some money, uh, to -- to -- to fly up to New York.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Or fly somewhere, so I think I did talk to him on the phone. Um, he might have called to say thank you or something like that.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Um, so I -- I do remember something like that but --

DET. BOHLING: All right.

G. GENTILE: I might have. I -- I just don't know.

DET. BOHLING: That's okay. I mean, I know we're going back a while here so --

G. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah. Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Um --

G. GENTILE: Have not had any communication with him in a really long time, though.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: I mean, when he left, um, I don't think I talked to him for sure after that.

DET. BOHLING: And going back to the computer -- I might have moved on too fast here.

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: When you were done with the computer, do you recall how long you actually had it for, that laptop that belonged to Kyle, approximately?

G. GENTILE: Might have been a couple of days.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Um, maybe it was just that day. I don't recall.

DET. BOHLING: All right.

G. GENTILE: Um, after printing the files out, it was shut down and there was nothing from that point. There was -- it wasn't turned on or -- or anything that I know of.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: So --

DET. BOHLING: And do you know how the computer got back to Tom? It -- did you deliver it yourself or --

G. GENTILE: Didn't deliver it myself. Uh, I actually don't know. I don't know if they came over and picked it up or --

DET. BOHLING: All right.

G. GENTILE: -- don't know.

DET. BOHLING: Obviously you went back to work then. You did your --

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: -- Monday back up to --

G. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: -- wherever you had to go.

G. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: All right. Have you had any contact at all with any other family members of Kyle

--

G. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: -- since any of this has gone on?

G. GENTILE: Uh-uh.

DET. BOHLING: His, uh -- any family up North or anywhere else in the country?

G. GENTILE: I know none of these people

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Zero contact.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: Have you --

G. GENTILE: Other than when he gave me that phone that night and I called, uh, I guess, his ex-wife.

DET. BOHLING: Right.

G. GENTILE: Nothing.

DET. BOHLING: Nothing?

G. GENTILE: Uh-uh.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Do you know if anybody else has -- has attempted to contact you regarding this case besides family members? Any other attorneys?

G. GENTILE: Just the lawyer. No, just, uh, this one lawyer that called and I had an interview. No one else has contacted me about the case.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. You -- do you feel comfortable that that was Tom's lawyer --

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: -- at the time?

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Johnson sounds familiar.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: He was a really older guy?

DET. BOHLING: Yeah. Paul Johnson.

G. GENTILE: Yeah, yeah. He's -- yeah.

DET. BOHLING: All right. Now, we know, too, at one point in time immediately after this took place, that Tom -- and I spoke to him the very -- actually, probably the same day, because when you got to him it was after midnight, from what we can assume

G. GENTILE: Okay.

DET. BOHLING: By the time you got to him.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: So we're talking the same day. Later that day --

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: -- I spoke with Tom.

G. GENTILE: Okay.

DET. BOHLING: And he made it clear that day that, uh, "I can't stay at the apartment anymore," and that, you know, "I'm -- this is just too much for me to deal with."

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: "I'm going to be staying in another location."

G. GENTILE: Okay.

DET. BOHLING: "We have some friends that are offering to help us out."

G. GENTILE: Okay.

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NARRATIVE

NARRATIVE (Cont.)

DET. BOHLING: Is that your rental property where he ended up going to in Pennsylvania Park up there?

G. GENTILE: Yes.

DET. BOHLING: It is?

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: And obviously he's still not at that location at this point in time?

G. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. And I guess there were -- there's rooms that were kind of rented out so one of the other people have just stayed after the -- they left

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: So, yeah

DET. BOHLING: So what I can see so far in the -- the interview that we've had, it sounds to me like, um, you and your wife had definitely reached out to help Tom at a time that he needed it.

G. GENTILE: Absolutely.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: I mean --

DET. BOHLING: I know that seems silly, but I -- I'm finding that out now I had never met you.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: I know a lot of things about this case but now that I get to meet you, you've just filled in a lot of blanks --

G. GENTILE: Yeah

DET. BOHLING: -- as to, you know, the rental property, the computer.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Um --

G. GENTILE: I mean, it would have been no less had it been one of our kids, right, that I would have thought Tom to do. It's a terrible thing.

DET. BOHLING: Right.

G. GENTILE: Um, that -- you know, to lose one of your kids. I can't even imagine what that's like. S --

DET. BOHLING: Well, I can see that just talking about it now is -- is kind of making you a little bit upset.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Have you ever been through anything like this before --

G. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: -- with your own family?

G. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: No, no. But it's -- you know, I could just -- I mean, I care about my kids and, uh, I can just imagine --

DET. BOHLING: Right

G. GENTILE: -- what that would do to somebody You know, and I put myself in that position, you know. We -- we were -- he called us in -- in just terrible condition. We just wanted to help him out

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Um, at any time, now, that all this is going on, have you ever sat back and

said, Wow, I'm trying to help somebody out and now look what's happened? Now I'm sitting at the hot seat at the police department.

G. GENTILE: Yeah, you're damn right.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. I appreciate your honesty. You know, but --

G. GENTILE: Like I said to you on the phone, the tragedy here, you know -- look at the food list. The guy's living on Twinkies and stuff, right?

DET. BOHLING: Uh-huh.

G. GENTILE: He's just a kid.

DET. BOHLING: Right.

G. GENTILE: Uh, it's a terrible thing.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: It really is a terrible thing. And that --

DET. BOHLING: Well --

G. GENTILE: And that's -- at the end of the day, um, you know, to -- to -- to try to take something where a guy has lost his son and, uh, try to make it out to something that, from my point of view, doesn't seem to be, just is terrible.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Well, you're definitely allowed to have that opinion. I mean, and that -- that's -- everybody has that right to express that.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: You know, my -- my main thing is to find out the facts.

G. GENTILE: Understood.

DET. BOHLING: And when -- you can see that I've done some homework here.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: This is all Kyle's file.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Because we wanna be sure that we do know the facts.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. I understand.

DET. BOHLING: You know? And then in speaking of that, is there any -- do you have any doubt or any concerns that you can think of that -- that Tom may have done something wrong here or might have been involved in Kyle's death?

G. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: Anything that you've been made aware of by Tom or anybody else?

G. GENTILE: Absolutely not.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. I would -- I would imagine your wife probably feels the same way?

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: I mean, we've known Tom as --

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: -- a nice guy. I mean, he's helped us out, you know, come over, spent time, you know, with our family. Invited him in. You know, why sit at home on Thanksgiving alone or whatever? I mean, you know, he just seems like a genuinely, really nice guy.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: And I would never think that he would do that.

DET. BOHLING: All right. I sat here and I've asked you a bunch of questions. Do you have any for me? What's fair is fair.

G. GENTILE: Uh --

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NARRATIVE

NARRATIVE (Cont.)

DET BOHLING: Anything that I can answer, anyway, 'cause it is an active investigation. But anything I can answer for you, I'll -- I'll do my best.

G. GENTILE: I mean, I -- I wouldn't even know what to ask. Like I said, it's, uh -- I don't actually know what's going on --

DET BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: -- uh, with the case. Obviously it -- it was important that we meet.

DET BOHLING: Yes

G. GENTILE: Uh, more so than even I thought, I guess. Um, you know, I guess maybe the -- the question is what is the status of -- of all of this?

DET BOHLING: Yeah.

G. GENTILE: I mean, have you guys gone through the laptop? Is there anything that you're concerned about?

DET BOHLING: Yeah, that's all been done.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. I mean --

DET BOHLING: I've had the computer forensically reviewed --

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET BOHLING: -- by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. So that's done. Um, I can't explain the results to you yet --

G. GENTILE: I see.

DET BOHLING: -- only because the investigation is still ongoing and active. And I have a responsibility to make sure that before -- even when the case is closed out, I have a responsibility to give that to Kyle's immediate family before I give it to anybody else.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. I -- I don't need -- to be honest, I know exactly what I did so I don't --

DET BOHLING: Right.

G. GENTILE: -- have any particular need, um, to know anything, to be honest.

DET BOHLING: Okay.

G. GENTILE: This has been such a -- you know, like you said, um, I thought I was helping a friend out, uh, in -- in a most terrible time. Um, and then to kind of get dragged into this is --

DET BOHLING: Yeah.

G. GENTILE: -- overwhelming.

DET BOHLING: Well, again, as long as you understand here that, uh, you know, you're -- you're not a suspect. You know, you're not gonna show up on the front page of the St. Pete Times tomorrow as saying, you know --

G. GENTILE: Right. I appreciate that.

DET BOHLING: -- Gerry -- Gerry Gentile, suspect

G. GENTILE: Right. Right. Right.

DET BOHLING: As -- as far as our angle from the police department and my investigation, that's not the case.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET BOHLING: Today was a meeting to come down --

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET BOHLING: -- and clarify some things --

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET BOHLING: -- that went on that I needed answers to.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET BOHLING: And that Kyle's family deserves answers to. Because most of Kyle's family was

not here.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: So they don't know everything.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: So we -- it's my job to find that out and then try and deliver it to the best way possible to them. And --

G. GENTILE: I -- I mean, maybe -- maybe you could help clarify. What are they actually accusing, I guess, Tom of? Are they accusing him that he could have killed his son or something? I mean --

DET. BOHLING: Well, I don't know --

G. GENTILE: -- I can't even imagine that

DET. BOHLING: I don't know if it's fair to get into that right now --

G. GENTILE: Okay.

DET. BOHLING: -- while this case is active. I think what I can say is being that these folks were not here, Kyle's mom, his stepdad, his brother -- being that they were not here and didn't know everything, there were some questions that were raised.

G. GENTILE: Okay.

DET. BOHLING: And I think, um, you know, this -- you probably already know this with -- with Tom and his wife, they may not be on eye-to-eye terms since the divorce or whatever goes on there. I don't know all those facts. But maybe --

G. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: -- they're not getting along as well.

G. GENTILE: Okay

DET. BOHLING: And then the tragedy of Kyle dying.

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: And I think there was concern --

G. GENTILE: Didn't help

DET. BOHLING: There was -- and I can understand the concern somewhat that getting a phone call from somebody other than Dad or even from a person that they knew, they felt comfortable they could trust.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah

DET. BOHLING: Because in the middle of the night they get a phone call and they're saying --

G. GENTILE: Yeah

DET. BOHLING: -- "Who the heck is this guy calling? Is he --"

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: "Is this a prank?"

G. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah. Yeah. Yeah. Yeah. Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: "Did somebody hurt Kyle?" So that, boom, right off the bat now --

G. GENTILE: Okay.

DET. BOHLING: -- they're on their toes

G. GENTILE: Okay.

DET. BOHLING: But again, they weren't here so they don't know the facts.

G. GENTILE: Yeah. If they would have ever seen him in the condition that he was in, I -- I -- I don't know. I wish, of course, there was video of this. I mean, the guy couldn't even -- his hands were literally doing this. I mean, they're --

DET. BOHLING: You're talking about Tom, you mean?

G. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Yeah.

G. GENTILE: You know? Okay.

DET. BOHLING: And maybe even some things that took place after the event took place.

D. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: A lot of it does have to do with different beliefs, whether you're a member of the Church of Scientology or you're not.

D. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: And I know that was part of your concern of coming in here, and I totally respect that. To me, I've left all that on the outside. I have to go in with my blinders off. I investigate everything. I'm not here to -- to question you about your beliefs or anything like that. That's not what this is about.

D. GENTILE: No, I know that.

DET. BOHLING: This is gonna be direct questions about Kyle.

D. GENTILE: Okay.

DET. BOHLING: And about Kyle's dad, who I think you know, and that's probably about it.

D. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: And then we'll be on out of here. So that's -- that's kinda what we're trying to accomplish here today.

Because one of the things that you and I talked about is that you know pretty much all the pieces of the puzzle, and she's the last piece that you have to fit in.

L. FUGATE: And I said, all the true facts -- I said, you know, one thing I learned from, you know, the other cases is that what's on the Internet and reality are way, way apart, and I said --

He's gonna know what -- ; know, what -- what -- what all the timelines are, what everything is, and so if he wants to ask you questions about that, you just answer the questions truthfully and honestly and we're off to the races." I said, "If this is some other agenda --" and when you talked to me, you said, "I got no other agenda." So I told Denise, I said, "You know, this ought to be --"

DET. BOHLING: Yeah.

L. FUGATE: "-- pretty much straight up and straight down." And so --

DET. BOHLING: (Unintelligible), yeah.

L. FUGATE: -- I'm here to be quiet after --

DET. BOHLING: All right. Yeah, no agenda here. This is -- this is the part of the criminal investigation. I have nothing to do with any litigation that may come after. This is the criminal investigation which I don't believe you're a part of.

D. GENTILE: Right.

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DET. BOHLING: I think the only reason your name comes up in this is merely because of the friendship with Mr. Brennan.

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: But once it comes up, then I have to go in and I have to find out, okay, what's going on, so I can eliminate you or include you.

DET. BOHLING: And that's basically what -- what happened with your husband, as well.

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: So if we could, I just wanna find out a little bit of the background about how you know Mr. Brennan. I don't know if you know him as Tom or Thomas or --

D. GENTILE: I know him as Tom. He's -- he's actually a good friend of mine.

D. GENTILE: Um, he did handyman work for me. I own some property. And then, um, at Christmastime -- you know, he's a chef by trade. Come over and cook dinner and we'd have him over. And then, um, I had a friend living with me, Wendy, who he then later married.

DET. BOHLING: Jerry, your husband?
D. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah.
DET. BOHLING: And he was at your house prior to that?
D. GENTILE: Yes.
DET. BOHLING: Prior to you getting the call?
D. GENTILE: Yes.
DET. BOHLING: Okay. Do you know where Tom was prior to being at your house?
D. GENTILE: Um, I think he was at work. I -- yeah, I think he was in Tampa.

DET. BOHLING: Now, I'm trying to figure out the best way to word this, and I don't want you to take any offense to it, because I surely don't mean any. I don't mean any disrespect. What would lead you to believe as to why he would call you before he would call anybody else, including, like, 911 or anything like that?

D. GENTILE: I believe because I was his closest friend.

DET. BOHLING: Do you believe that to be the case?

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

D. GENTILE: Yeah. Well, yeah.

DET. BOHLING: So you -- is it fair to say that when he did call you, you don't think he had called 911 yet? I know you said he was hyperventilating. He obviously sounded --

D. GENTILE: Right, was definitely in shock. I have -- well, I had -- I don't know if he had called them, but I know he said, "What do I do?"

DET. BOHLING: Right.

D. GENTILE: I assumed, well, I hope you called 911. So I said, "Call 911."

DET. BOHLING: Right.

D. GENTILE: And did he -- do you remember what he said or did after that, once you told him that?

D. GENTILE: He said, "Okay," and hung up.

DET. BOHLING: He hung up?

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Did he call you back again or did you call him back at any time or --

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: Because that had come into the investigation early on.

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: That maybe this gentleman who was obviously upset at what he observed --

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: -- made some calls. Did he call 911 first or did he call someone else first?

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: And there was indications, well, he might have called his advisor, his church advisor first.

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: Did he --

D. GENTILE: I'm not -- I'm not a church advisor. I will tell you, Tom and I were really good friends.

DET. BOHLING: And that -- that's fine.

D. GENTILE: And -- and I don't know how to describe our friendship, but we just were. Like, he -- I don't know, he -- I don't know how to describe it. We were just friends.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: And that's -- that's -- that's all I need to hear. Again, I just wanted -- I didn't know if there was something, any truth to the advisor thing.

D. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: Sometimes things come in -- come into an investigation that aren't always true.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: And that's why I wanted to get with the person face-to-face and could answer a lot of those questions. So you just did that. I appreciate it.

D. GENTILE: All right.

DET. BOHLING: All right. The other thing that I wanted to get with you with -- I'm sure Jerry told you about -- was the computer issue.

D. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: Um, it's my understanding that it -- maybe it was -- is it your daughter or Jerry's daughter? I'm not sure how that works.

D. GENTILE: My daughter.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Your daughter?

D. GENTILE: Yeah, who happened to be downtown.

DET. BOHLING: She -- was she the one that took possession of the computer? Can you explain that to me so I have a better understanding of the chain of custody, for lack of a better term?

D. GENTILE: Yeah. So the next day after the event, um, this event, Tom didn't wanna live at his apartment anymore. He just wanted to move out. And, um, I had gone downtown. I said, well, let me just go make sure how bad it is. And I went upstairs and it was actually pretty cleaned up. It wasn't that

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horrible. I went back downstairs and says, "Tom, the place isn't bad." I had an appointment to go to. My daughter was downtown getting coffee at Starbucks.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

D. GENTILE: And, um, she just said, "Well, Tom, I'll help you. I'll go up there with you and I'll help you." And she was living at home at the time.

DET. BOHLING: She was living at home with you?

D. GENTILE: Yes.

DET. BOHLING: So she offered to help Tom, what, clean up the apartment --

D. GENTILE: With every --

DET. BOHLING: -- or help pack things up?

D. GENTILE: Everything, get everything out.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Now, what -- what's -- what's her name, the -- the daughter that we're speaking of?

D. GENTILE: Taylor

DET. BOHLING: Taylor. Is she the one that actually ended up taking possession of the computer?

D. GENTILE: See, I think Tom took possession of it, and -- 'cause he was going back to the house. I don't know that -- well, maybe -- I thought Tom took it because Tom packed up all of his stuff. I don't know if she ever touched it or whatever, but I know either one of them did and took it back to the house and --

DET. BOHLING: To your house?

D. GENTILE: That's correct.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. And that -- that was for the purpose of --

D. GENTILE: So that Jerry can look, because Tom had no idea. Tom had thought he had spent a great day with his son the day before to watch this "Batman" movie. He was, like, so relieved. Tom -- he thought Kyle looked better, was eating better. So he had hoped that maybe Kyle had left a note.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

D. GENTILE: I mean, Tom isn't, um, very computer literate.

DET. BOHLING: A note on the computer, you mean?

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

D. GENTILE: Yeah, 'cause -- he didn't find anything (unintelligible).

DET. BOHLING: Right. Now, did Tom tell you that himself, that he wanted your husband to look at the computer, or did you hear that through your husband or --

D. GENTILE: I think he said --

DET. BOHLING: How did that work?

D. GENTILE: -- "Maybe Jerry can look and see if Kyle left anything."

DET. BOHLING: Okay. All right. And if I understood then, when you said earlier the day after when you went over to -- to help Tom, after -- obviously after we were all gone, or the police that were there --

D. GENTILE: Yeah, he had gotten --

DET. BOHLING: -- you did go in the apartment.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

D. GENTILE: He had gotten word that -- he had expressed a -- a desire to move out.

DET. BOHLING: Right.

D. GENTILE: And he'd gotten the okay to go do that.

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DET. BOHLING: Yeah. Because I remember he actually called -- when he called, I wasn't here yet, but then later that day I spoke with him.

D. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: And he was talking about trying to move somewhere else for a while, 'cause he just couldn't be there.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. So we can't be sure that if Taylor actually took the computer from the apartment to your house, or Tom brought it from there to your house, but somehow it got to your house.

D. GENTILE: Yeah. Well, I know they were traveling in the same car.

DET. BOHLING: Uh, Tom and Taylor?

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

D. GENTILE: Yeah. Because I had an appointment, and I had brought Tom down in my car, and then left. So it was only Taylor's car left.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. So when did you first meet up with Tom then that -- that day? Did -- did he come to your house, or did you meet him somewhere else? Or I should say, you know, like, the day after. The night goes by.

D. GENTILE: He stayed at our house.

DET. BOHLING: At that -- I didn't know that.

D. GENTILE: Oh, okay.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. So he ended up spending the night at your house after he left --

D. GENTILE: Did you want me to leave him there?

DET. BOHLING: No, I -- I didn't -- I truly didn't know that.

D. GENTILE: No, I understand. It's just remembering. (Unintelligible) see me.

DET. BOHLING: Right. So did he come --

D. GENTILE: But he came home.

DET. BOHLING: With Jerry?

D. GENTILE: Yes, yeah. And then, uh, he asked Jerry if he'd call Victoria, which Jerry did, and -- so, yeah, he spent the night.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Have you ever spoken with Victoria at any time, either before this incident or after?

D. GENTILE: Once.

DET. BOHLING: Do you remember what that was about?

D. GENTILE: Yes. Tom was concerned about Kyle, and he thought that we -- something should be done, like, he should go somewhere. He should get some help. Kyle had told him that, um, he wasn't taking anything. There wasn't any drugs. Victoria had told Tom that, um, he was on psychiatric meds. Anyways, I didn't know what the situation was, but, um, I had just spoken to her about potentially getting, I guess, Kyle help. Actually, the way it went was Tom said, "Here's my friend Denise. Talk to her about this." And we spoke briefly about it, the various things.

DET. BOHLING: On the phone?

D. GENTILE: Yes. And Victoria says, "Well, he doesn't have a drug problem -- problem. He's never been on street drugs." And I said, "Oh, okay." And I gave the phone back to Tom. This was on Tom's cell phone one day at lunch when --

DET. BOHLING: Right. And was it the time frame that Kyle had already arrived here from when he came from out on the West Coast, or was it a time before that?

D. GENTILE: Um, I think it was in February. It was not in September. It was in February. I'm not sure

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if Kyle was here at the time or if Tom already knew that Kyle was -- had run away from home and it was just during interim talk.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. So then it probably -- at the time that -- that you spoke with her then, you don't think Kyle was here yet, but soon after that is when he arrived.

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: And then all -- all these incidents happened.

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

D. GENTILE: I can't be certain, just so you know.

DET. BOHLING: No. And I don't --

D. GENTILE: 'Cause I never saw Kyle at any -- you know.

DET. BOHLING: I don't expect you to, especially it's, what, a year and several months beyond. So I do understand that.

D. GENTILE: Okay.

DET. BOHLING: No problem. Was there any time -- did you ever get to spend any time alone with Kyle, where he expressed any concerns to you or anything like that?

D. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: When he did arrive? And did you ever see him when he actually did arrive here, that you remember?

D. GENTILE: Uh-uh.

DET. BOHLING: No?

D. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Now, as far as the computer getting back to Tom --

D. GENTILE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: -- do you remember how that happened, once your husband was done with it?

D. GENTILE: I don't -- I think either Jerry gave it to him or Taylor did.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

D. GENTILE: I mean, I --

L. FUGATE: Can -- can I ask you a question, just for my --

DET. BOHLING: Sure.

L. FUGATE: Is -- is -- he's staying at your house, Tom?

D. GENTILE: Just -- just for that evening.

L. FUGATE: Okay.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

L. FUGATE: Okay.

D. GENTILE: Just that night.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

L. FUGATE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: And when he did come back to your house that night after all this happened, by then it was morning.

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: Did Jerry bring him back with him? Did he drive his own car? Or --

D. GENTILE: No, Jerry brought him back with him.

DET. BOHLING: He did.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Did Tom ever explain to you any concerns that he had of anything, that he

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was afraid that somebody had hurt Kyle or anything like that?

D. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: No?

D. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: At the apartment that night, no?

D. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: Do you have any concerns yourself? Has anybody given you a hard time about this case, or threatened you in any way or anything like that, anything you'd be willing to tell me?

D. GENTILE: No, I haven't been threatened at all.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. So you took -- feel totally safe, then, out there? Nobody's --

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: -- giving you a hard time or anything?

D. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. How about with your husband? Has anybody been giving him a hard time or --

D. GENTILE: No. No.

DET. BOHLING: Did he --

D. GENTILE: You know, he works out of town.

DET. BOHLING: Well, I do know that.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: That's what I was asking you.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: And I want to be sure that, you know, you have a safety zone going on here.

D. GENTILE: Yeah. No, everything's fine.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. So no problems with Jerry, then, anybody giving him a hard time?

D. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: Or any of your children?

D. GENTILE: No.

L. FUGATE: Can -- can I ask a question? Is there a concern or is that just a -- a question?

DET. BOHLING: No, I don't --

L. FUGATE: Oh, okay.

DET. BOHLING: If I did, I'd tell her --

L. FUGATE: All right. Yeah. That's fine.

DET. BOHLING: -- or I'd tell you or I would have told Jerry. I just wanted to make sure.

L. FUGATE: All right. That -- that -- that's all that -- my concern.

DET. BOHLING: If something was going on on her end that maybe she was afraid to tell us about --

L. FUGATE: Okay.

DET. BOHLING: -- like, someone's calling the house, hang-up phone calls or, you know, just prank calling, whatever.

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: That's not the case, though.

D. GENTILE: No.

DET. BOHLING: Uh, yeah, I don't have any information to say that this young lady's in danger.

L. FUGATE: Well, that's the only reason I asked. I was just concerned --

DET. BOHLING: Yeah.

L. FUGATE: -- about it, is there something that --

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DET. BOHLING: Not at all.

L. FUGATE: Okay. (Unintelligible).

DET. BOHLING: Nothing to my knowledge. And there's a lot of things that are going on out there right now.

L. FUGATE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Um, our department is aware of a lot of them because of the different phone calls that come into the church, the hang-up calls, the protests that go on. So I have a pretty good idea of what's going on out there.

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: And unfortunately, when this all happened with Kyle, the -- it hits the news. It hits the Internet. These things go on and on. You know, I don't have to tell you.

L. FUGATE: Oh, yeah. The Internet's just unbelievable.

DET. BOHLING: Yeah.

L. FUGATE: Unbelievable.

DET. BOHLING: My only goal is to make sure that nobody harmed Kyle.

L. FUGATE: Uh-huh.

DET. BOHLING: That -- I -- I work in Robbery/Homicide here at the police department.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: My goal is to make sure that nobody else put him in danger and hurt him. That's -- that's what this whole investigation is all about. Now, when I was speaking with Jerry, when I had him in here, it was my understanding that once he moved from the Cleveland Street address, he moved to another location on Pennsylvania.

D. GENTILE: That's correct.

DET. BOHLING: Which was one of your properties

D. GENTILE: That's correct.

DET. BOHLING: So again, this is just pretty much helping out a friend

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Okay. Do you remember how long he was there for, approximately, before he moved out?

D. GENTILE: Um, three months.

DET. BOHLING: Okay.

D. GENTILE: He ultimately went to New York to be with his wife

DET. BOHLING: Yeah. That's another thing I found out today that I didn't know. I didn't know that you were the connection with Wendy.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: I had no idea.

D. GENTILE: You've met Wendy.

DET. BOHLING: Yeah. I met her -- I did meet -- was it once or twice? I met her twice. I met her one day, and then the very next day I went back and I met her again.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: And I think she's originally from New York.

D. GENTILE: She is.

DET. BOHLING: That's why we hit it off, 'cause she heard my accent, I heard hers, and it was, like, okay.

D. GENTILE: Yeah. Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: I'd say that's just about all I got. Do you have any questions for me? It's only fair.

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I asked you a whole bunch. You can throw some at me now.

D. GENTILE: No. I'm -- I just think it's sad that Tom would lose his son and have to go through this. Not because of you --

DET. BOHLING: Right.

D. GENTILE: -- but because it's just, you know -- give the guy a break. Not you, but, you know?

DET. BOHLING: It -- it --

D. GENTILE: That's my only emotion on it. It's, like, blah.

DET. BOHLING: I saw that in your husband when I had him in here and I interviewed him. And at one point he actually became quite upset because of what he had -- from what he tells me -- what he observed Tom going through that morning, from the moment that he showed up, and saw the physical changes in Tom.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: After he just saw what he saw.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: And he was really upset at the fact that anybody else would think that Tom had something to do with it, or harm him. And I told him, well, it -- it may not just be about that.

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: There's a lot of things that are going on here. The most sad thing is that this young man passed away.

D. GENTILE: Yes.

DET. BOHLING: And in the way that it happened. And there's other issues and beliefs that are surrounding it now that are making it even more difficult.

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: That's the true unfortunate part.

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: If I had any reason to believe that somebody harmed Kyle, this would be a whole different kind of investigation.

D. GENTILE: Right.

DET. BOHLING: You know? So like, everybody that I met with so far has been real cooperative and forthright with their information, but they've also been concerned. Some people have really been concerned.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: Do I wanna go in and talk to the police about this matter? You know, do I need to get some legal advice first? I fully understand that.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: You know, the bottom line is, though, it's -- it is tragic that this young man passed away --

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: -- this way, you know, and -- it's very tragic. And I hope that everybody is able to -- to get through it, on both sides of the family and friends, you know.

D. GENTILE: Yeah.

DET. BOHLING: So no questions for me?

D. GENTILE: No. I'm good.

DET. BOHLING: Painless, right?

D. GENTILE: Yeah. I'm fine. Thank you.

DET. BOHLING: Wasn't like TV where --

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D. GENTILE: No, no.

DET. BOHLING: You know, get up --

D. GENTILE: I was gonna (unintelligible) --

L. FUGATE: (Unintelligible).

DET. BOHLING: Get up with the phone book and start banging it on the desk. It's not like that.

L. FUGATE: Well, I appreciate you letting me come. I told her that, you know, it's -- I -- I just -- really, again, our concern was -- was when we talked about it and we looked at all the, you know, conjecture, and I said, you know, it's so far from the reality. But it's a concern --

DET. BOHLING: Yes.

L. FUGATE: -- so you know, you've got to (unintelligible) --

D. GENTILE: Yeah. He's being --

L. FUGATE: I appreciate it.

D. GENTILE: -- (unintelligible) that, right?

DET. BOHLING: Yes.

L. FUGATE: And we'll -- you know, let me ask you a question, though. Um, because I should know and 'cause we've done all kinds of public records law stuff in the past. But ultimately, you're -- you're gonna do a final, you know, close-out of whatever you do, and then that is gonna, uh, be available to, I suppose, the family, if they want to file a lawsuit. I saw --

DET. BOHLING: Oh, absolutely.

L. FUGATE: So I saw the -- okay. I just wanted -- and we can get a copy of that, uh, just so we can, you know -- because I'm sure from what I've read that they -- if they decide to file a lawsuit, one of the things that they're gonna try to target is probably, you know, you or Jerry for the -- oh, well, actually, I'm sure they wouldn't target you or Jerry. They would probably target others, but, uh, you know, that -- that was, uh, one of the concerns. So --

DET. BOHLING: It -- it could be something in the future where you may be questioned by somebody else other than me in law enforcement, maybe another attorney or someone like that.

L. FUGATE: Well, I saw the posting, 'cause I know, uh, Luke Lirot. I saw that they had posted -- and -- and frankly, I'd be a little bit surprised, because it -- it -- it's totally different factually and legally when you go to look at -- you know, at -- at -- at the -- at the law. But Luke I know, and Luke maybe I can deal with in terms of, you know, what this case is -- is about --

DET. BOHLING: Uh-huh.

L. FUGATE: -- or not about, and I'm not sure that that's not a posting. 'Cause I would never -- I wouldn't call him, you know, until I know what -- he'd have to call me.

DET. BOHLING: Sure.

L. FUGATE: I saw that, so I was concerned. Well, I appreciate it. And I thank you.

DET. BOHLING: No problem. Thanks for coming down.

L. FUGATE: We're free to go? She doesn't have to stay?

DET. BOHLING: No, she's free to go unless she's looking for a vacation. 'Cause sometimes we get people in here, like, "Just keep me here. I need a little bit of a vacation."

D. GENTILE: No, I got to go get my little grandbaby.

DET. BOHLING: Thank you very much for coming.

D. GENTILE: All right.

DET. BOHLING: It was nice to meet you, Denise.

D. GENTILE: Thank you.

DET. BOHLING: I'll walk you folks down.

L. FUGATE: Okay. Thank you. I don't want to put the jacket on, but I will just to be --

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DET. BOHLING: Thank you, sir. I appreciate you coming down. So now you can say you were at the police department, right?

PREVIOUS CASE STATUS:

INVESTIGATION:

On 08-27-2008 at approximately 1600 hours, I attempted to make telephone contact with Attorney Luke Lirot as I had not received a return call from 08-18-2008. At this time, I spoke with a male who advised that Lirot was currently out of town on business. I requested that Lirot contact me when he returns to the area.

INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

- + Kyle Brennan was diagnosed by Dr. Stephen McNamara as having exhibited early signs of Schizophrenia to include depression, delusions and paranoia. As a result, Kyle was prescribed to take one Lexapro 10mg per day.
- + Kyle's Lexapro prescription was last known to be filled on 11-24-2006 for thirty [30] pills.
- + Kyle had been residing with his mother and Step-father in Virginia up until 11-27-2006 at which time he left the residence on his own accord.
- + Kyle had in his possession several thousand dollars that he had withdrawn from his bank account at the time he left Virginia.
- + Kyle's mother advises that Kyle had never left home before however; after a couple of weeks, she did contact the Police Department in Virginia and was advised that there was not enough information regarding

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Kyle's condition to be entered into the NCIC System as Missing and Endangered

+ On or about 01-07-2007, Victoria Britton received a telephone call from FBI Special Agent Jeff Atwood in Des Moines, Iowa who advised that Kyle had walked into his FBI office on that date. During this time, Kyle advised Special Agent Atwood that he was being followed and that "They were after him". Special Agent Atwood contacted authorities in Charlottesville, Virginia in an effort to see if Kyle had been listed as Missing and/or Endangered. Special Agent Atwood learned that no report had been filed. Special Agent Atwood obtained Kyle's home telephone number from Kyle prior to him leaving the office and then contacted Victoria Britton to advise of his contact with her son. When Kyle arrived at the FBI office, it is reported that he had in his possession over \$5000.00 in cash and appeared undernourished and emaciated.

+ On or about 01-08-2007, Kyle was reported to have arrived at his Aunt's residence in San Diego, California during which time he remained with his Aunt until approximately 01-15-2007. It is reported that Kyle had told his Aunt that persons were hunting him down. It is reported that the Aunt believed that Kyle was acting in a paranoid manner during his visit with her.

+ Victoria Britton reported that on or about 01-22-2007, she received a cell phone bill in Kyle's name indicating that Kyle had purchased a cell phone. Victoria Britton reviewed the tolls on the bill and noted that Kyle had numerous calls to the Des Moines, Iowa FBI office. The last call on that specific bill is reported to be on 01-12-2007 which was made to Kyle's Aunt in San Diego, California.

+ Victoria Britton filed a Missing Persons report for Kyle with the Albemarle County Virginia Police Department on 01-23-2007/Report #2007-00765.

+ It is reported that Kyle left San Diego, California and then traveled to Maui, Hawaii where he was involved in an incident whereby the Police were contacted.

+ Kyle then returned to California and contacted his father, Thomas Brennan, via telephone and advised that he was out of money. Thomas Brennan was residing at 423 Cleveland Street, apartment #4 at that time. Thomas Brennan then made arrangements with Kyle to fly into Tampa Florida so that he could reside with him in Clearwater. Thomas Brennan and Victoria Britton, who are divorced, did discuss this matter at which time it was agreed that Kyle would stay with Thomas Brennan in Clearwater Florida.

+ Kyle arrived in Florida in early February 2007 at which time Thomas Brennan and Kyle spoke of his depression and the fact that Kyle was not taking his prescribed Lexapro on a regular basis. According to Thomas Brennan, Kyle advised that he did not like taking the Lexapro. Thomas Brennan advised that approximately one day after Kyle arrived in Clearwater, he [Thomas Brennan] came home to the apartment and found that the door to the guest bedroom was closed. Thomas Brennan advised that he learned that Kyle had placed furniture in front of the interior of the bedroom door however; Kyle did not tell him why he had done this.

+ According to Thomas Brennan, he and Kyle agreed that Kyle would stop taking the Lexapro medication and start utilizing better nutrition habits and vitamins to assist with his well-being. Thomas Brennan placed the Lexapro medication into his own vehicle at which time Kyle appeared to be improving his eating and sleeping habits.

+ Thomas Brennan advised that he did not force Kyle to stop taking his Lexapro and that the choice to stop taking the Lexapro was a mutual agreement. Thomas Brennan advised that Kyle had not been taking the Lexapro on a regular basis prior to his arrival in Clearwater Florida. This was confirmed to be credible at the time of Officer Jonathan Yuen's arrival on 02-17-2007 during which time there were 16 Lexapro pills located within the prescription bottle. As noted prior, this prescription was filled on 11-24-2006 with a start count of 30.

+ The review of the Pinellas County 911 Center records indicate that the original 911 call was placed at 00:01:17 by telephone number _____ The call was dispatched

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to the Clearwater Fire Department at 00:01:52 with the first Clearwater Fire Department Rescue Unit arriving at 00:05:19.

+ The review of the Clearwater Police Department CADS document indicates that the call was first transferred to the Clearwater Police Department at 00:02:40 and dispatched at 00:04:27. District II Patrol Officer Brett Faulk arrived on scene first and made contact with Clearwater Fire Department officials at 00:05:53. Kyle Brennan was pronounced deceased at 00:07:15 by Clearwater Fire Department Rescue Paramedics.

+ The investigation revealed that Thomas Brennan left the apartment on 02-16-2007 at approximately 1700 hours at which time he traveled to the Fairgrounds in Tampa to pass out reading Literature. Thomas Brennan returned home near midnight on 02-17-2007 and noted that there were five-gallon Crystal Springs water jugs up against the interior of the entry door to the apartment. Thomas Brennan called out to his son however; there was no answer. Thomas Brennan advised that upon entry, he could smell the odor of gunpowder. Thomas Brennan then went into his bedroom and located Kyle on the floor with an apparent gunshot wound to the head. Thomas Brennan checked for signs of life and noted that Kyle was unresponsive.

* Thomas Brennan then contacted his friend, identified as Denise Gentile, and advised her of his findings. Denise Gentile advised

to call 911 which written 911 records indicate

* During my interview with Denise Gentile on 08-27-2008, she confirmed that Thomas Brennan did stop at her residence on the way home from work on 02-16-2007 at approximately 2300 hours. Thomas Brennan remained at her residence for a short time, borrowed a book from her and then left the residence to go home. Denise Gentile advised that approximately 10 minutes after Thomas Brennan left her residence, he called her and advised; "Oh my God Denise, Kyle shot himself." Denise advised that Thomas Brennan also advised; "Kyle committed suicide" and asked her; "What do I do?". Denise advised Thomas Brennan to contact 911 at which time Thomas Brennan advised; "Okay" and immediately hung up the telephone. Denise advised that Thomas Brennan sounded as though he was "hyperventilating" when he contacted her via telephone. Denise advised me that although she is a Church of Scientology member, she is not an Advisor or Chaplain at the organization.

+ Denise Gentile confirmed during her interview that she asked her husband, Gerry Gentile, to go to Thomas Brennan's apartment after Brennan called her so that he could support Brennan. Denise also confirmed that Thomas Brennan did stay at her residence with her and her husband after the investigation was completed at Brennan's apartment.

+ During my interview with Gerry Gentile on 07-13-2008, he confirmed that Thomas Brennan did call his wife Denise Gentile on 02-16-2008 and advised that he had returned home and found his son had committed suicide. Gerry confirmed that he went to Thomas Brennan's apartment at which time the Police were already on scene. In fact, Gerry advised that when he did arrive, an Officer questioned him about who he was and the fact that he was not allowed near the apartment. Gerry Gentile, during my interview with him, also confirmed the fact that no one else was with Thomas Brennan [With the exception of the Police Officers] when he arrived at the apartment. Gerry confirmed that when he met with Thomas Brennan outside the apartment, Brennan's "Hands were shaking really bad" and that Brennan advised him; "I can't dial my phone." Gentile asked Thomas Brennan if there was anything that he could do for him and if there was someone he needed to call. Gerry advised that Thomas Brennan advised him that he would need to call Kyle's mother and advise her of his findings. Gerry advised that he offered to do this for him because Thomas Brennan was so distraught. Gerry confirmed that he contacted Kyle's mother via cell phone at which time a female answered the phone. Gerry advised that he told Kyle's mom that Kyle had passed away at which time a male then came onto the telephone asking him; "Who is this?" Gerry advised that the male on the telephone sounded as if he had a "Mean voice" at which time he [Gentile] told the male that he

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was Thomas Brennan's friend and that he was calling because Thomas Brennan was not coherent at that time. Gentile then passed the cell phone to Thomas Brennan. Gerry believed that the male may have hung the telephone up before Thomas Brennan had a chance to speak with him. Gerry advised that Thomas Brennan may have contacted another family member via cell phone immediately after the phone call to Kyle's mother however; he could not be positive of the person he contacted.

+ During my interview with Gerry Gentile, he confirmed that Thomas Brennan spoke with his wife [Denise Gentile] the day after Kyle was discovered in the apartment and asked her if he [Gerry Gentile] could review Kyle's computer to "See if there's anything on there that would help me understand what happened." Gerry confirmed that the computer was brought to his residence by Denise Gentile's Daughter, Taylor on 02-18-2007. Gentile advised that later on that same day, he reviewed the contents of the computer. [This would be consistent with the computer being accessed on 02-18-2007 as identified by FDLE Special Agent Barbara Mendez during her forensic review of Kyle Brennan's computer]

+ Gerry Gentile confirmed that he entered into the "My Documents" directory and attempted to print files of interest however; he noted that the files were in a Microsoft Works program. Gentile advised that he can not open files from Microsoft Works in any of his computers and that the laptop computer did not have a printer driver that was compatible to the printer he had at his residence. As a result, Gentile advised that he copied the Microsoft Works files onto a thumb drive. Gentile advised that he then accidentally copied the contents of the thumb drive back onto Kyle Brennan's computer. Gentile realized his error and then erased the files that he had accidentally copied back onto Kyle Brennan's computer. Gentile printed out copies of all of the files that he had copied and provided copies of these same documents to Thomas Brennan. I reviewed the documents that Gentile brought with him to the interview and noted that the following files were accessed on Kyle Brennan's computer on 02-18-2007;

- 1] CyberLink file accessed on 02-18-2007 @ 12:53 P.M.
- 2] My Music file accessed on 02-18-2007 @ 12:53 P.M.
- 3] My Pictures file accessed on 02-18-2007 @ 12:53 P.M.
- 4] Battle Plan.doc accessed on 02-18-2007 @ 3:19 P.M.
- 5] Kyle's monthly food surplus doc accessed on 02-18-2007 @ 3:20 P.M.
- 6] Weekly schedule.doc on 02-18-2007 @ 3:20 P.M.

+ Gentile provided the printed copies of the documents to me at which time the documents were consistent with the documents that Thomas Brennan's Attorney, Paul B. Johnson, mailed to me on 11-28-2007.

+ I received Kyle Brennan's computer via mail from Kyle's family on 09-13-2007. I transported the computer to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement in Tampa Florida on 09-13-2008 at which time Special Agent Barbara Mendez completed a forensic review of the hard drive. The forensic review indicates that Kyle Brennan's computer was accessed on 02-18-2007, 02-21-2007, 02-24-2007, 02-26-2007 and 09-09-2007. Special Agent Mendez advised that a review of the files indicated no evidence that any files in question had been deleted. However; Special Agent Mendez advised that she had located a grouped file titled; "Suspicious Activity" that appeared to have been created on 09-09-2007. This specific file is believed to have been created by Kyle Brennan's Sister-in-Law Mia Brennan during her review of the computer in Virginia. Due to the type of program that was utilized to access and move this file, [Identified as Bigfix.exe] the file can no longer be accessed for review.

+ This investigation revealed that Kyle Brennan contacted the Clearwater Police Department on 02-06-2007 @ 0309 hours from his own cell phone. I ordered the recorded phone call and reviewed the entire conversation between Kyle and the Dispatcher during which time Kyle speaks of concern for his

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own safety. Kyle advised within the conversation that he believed that his own family may be trying to harm and/or kill him and that he wanted to place the call to the Police Department in the event that anything ever happened to him. Kyle also spoke of previously meeting with the Sheriff in Clearwater and that the Sheriff appeared as though he would assist him with his situation. Kyle spoke of the fact that he was trying to improve his life and had been through a difficult time. Kyle spoke of the fact that he was currently in Hawaii and was planning on moving to Clearwater soon. During the recording, Kyle did not speak of any specific person who may bring harm to him.

+ I have reviewed the contents of Kyle's cellphone after submitting the item to Detective Will Smith for a Forensic Review. I noted no signs of foul play within the photographs and videos located within the cellphone.

+ I have reviewed the crime scene photographs and noted no signs of foul play. District Six Medical Examiner's Office Investigator Marti Scholl responded to the original scene on 02-17-2007 and did not observe any signs of foul play or suspicious activity on the body or within the apartment. The photographs of the scene confirm the fact that the hand written words; "Look inside" were observed on Kyle's stomach area. There was also written documentation within Kyle's front right pocket that read as follows; [Typed exactly as written]

- Not enough people wanted to help
Corrupt cops and very bad people
and people that simply didn't care.

- My family has been trying to ruin my life for years-
either using their many friends
or bribing people.

- Des Moines, IA; Waterloo, IA;
Maui, Hawaii; Albemarle County,
VA All had corrupt cops and
I tried reporting it to the FBI
but dispatchers didn't report a
thing - in fact they merely taunted
me. Homeland security as well
did not help me, nor did
any of my other [Unreadable word]

Grand larceny, racketeering
assault, police corruption,
and much worse My family and the police and their friends
are guilty of.

Bill Rudd, Mr. Wright (former Principle
at Albemarle High School), and
various others will tell you about my
family at many different places [End of letter]

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- * There was a paper located in Kyle's front left pocket that read; "11:00". There were also five [5] unfired Winchester 357 bullets located within Kyle's front left pocket.
- +The firearm located at the scene was identified as a Taurus 357 Magnum Revolver that had four [4] unfired rounds within the cylinder and one spent casing within the cylinder.
- + The Pinellas County Sheriff's Office Forensic Section did process the firearm, all of the ammunition, the spent casing and the listed notes for finger prints however; there were negative results for ridge detail on these items.

INVESTIGATIVE CONCLUSION:

After a thorough investigation that included numerous interviews, document reviews, recording reviews, cellphone/cellphone records review and a forensic computer review, there is no evidence to suggest that there was any violation of Florida State criminal statutes. As stated in my supplement report dated for 07-27-2007, the following Statutes were reviewed and considered for this investigation;

F.S.S. 790.17: Furnishing weapons to minors under 18 years of age or persons of unsound mind and furnishing firearms to minors under 18 years of age prohibited. Within this section, the law prohibits selling, hiring, bartering, lending, transferring or giving any minor under 18 years of age any dirk, electric weapon or device or other weapon, other than an ordinary pocketknife, without permission of the minor's parent or guardian, or selling, hiring, bartering, lending, transferring or giving to any person of unsound mind an electric weapon or device or any dangerous weapon, other than an ordinary pocketknife. Due to the fact that; 1] Kyle Brennan was twenty [20] years of age at the time of this incident and; 2]The firearm was not provided to him, this statute does not apply.

F.S.S. 790.174: Safe Storage of Firearms Required. Within this section, the law pertains to the proper storage and security of a firearm so that minors, under the age of sixteen [16], will not have access. Due to Kyle Brennan's adult age at the time of this incident, this statute does not apply

As stated in my supplement report dated 07-27-2007, the investigation revealed that Kyle Brennan had been exhibiting early signs of Schizophrenia to include paranoia and delusions and that Lexapro had been prescribed. Kyle's doctor, Dr. McNamera, advised that Lexipro should be administered on a long term and regular basis in order to attain the proper results. The investigation revealed that Kyle was not taking his medication as prescribed. The original Lexapro prescription was assigned to Kyle Brennan on 11-24-2006 for 30 pills. At the time of the original investigation on 02-17-2007, there were 16 pills found within the prescription bottle. Dr. McNamera also advised that he was not aware of any major side effects if one was to suddenly stop taking the medication Lexapro.

The review of the physical evidence and statements provided by persons involved in this incident are consistent with the District Six Medical Examiner's Office findings of Suicide. The Sixth Judicial Circuit of the State Attorney's Office has also conducted an independent review of this incident and concurs with the findings of this investigation as well as the District Six Medical Examiner's Office investigation.

At this time, the status of this investigation will be changed from Active to Closed/Other. The computer, computer case and photographs that were mailed to me by Victoria Britton were delivered back to Britton's Attorney, Luke Lirot, on 11-06-2008 at approximately 1120 hours. I delivered the listed items to Attorney Luke Lirot's office located at 2240 Belleair Road, suite #190 in Clearwater. I received
